What a delightfully different Christmas story this proved to be! For Winter, being the youngest daughter of Santa Claus comes with its own drawbacks - especially when he's so overprotective! Novellas are the perfect medium for Christmas themed stories: perfect to read in one sitting under a blanket on a gray day. That said, I think I would have gladly read a full length novel about Ryan and Winter and their roller-coaster week before Christmas. BITTERSWEET CHRISTMAS featured characters that got you invested quickly and kept you hooked until the end.

Winter was a great, well-developed heroine. She's half-pixie, which makes her a bit impetuous and flighty, but she's caring too. Yes, she screws up big time, but it fits with the character and she fights hard to make it right. I got a kick out of people telling Ryan to be careful because Winter's dad is a really important, scary man. They're not wrong: you don't want to piss off Father Christmas.

There was one point in the story where I felt a conflict was resolved too quickly, but since it's only 122 pages long, I'll let it slide. Other than that the pacing was really satisfying. As Christmas approaches and the chapters count down the days, the action and passion heat up, culminating in a satisfying end to both. The relationship moves at a realistic pace and had a believable connection.

I've not read any of the other ORDER books but I wasn't at all confused by anything in BITTERSWEET CHRISTMAS, which is impressive. If you want original characters with a good serving of holiday cheer, pick up this novella right now.

This was such a treat! I loved every second of *Bittersweet Christmas*; from its version of Father Christmas, quirky and mischievous Winter, our sexy and brooding were-pire (yes, a werepire: a hybrid between werewolf and vampire) Ryan, to the action, suspense and holiday spirit it includes. It has it all.

John Ryan was a human working for The Order, after being attacked by werewolves and subsequently turned into a vampire by his friend, he's been secluded in the offices as no one knows exactly what to expect of him. The volatile nature of his new powers, along with a pack of werewolves seeking revenge, forced him to stay away from his nephew. Even if he's the only family young Liam has left, he can't risk putting him in danger. He was broody and sexy, a bit of a jerk at times but in the end, really sweet and protective of those he cares for.

Winter is not only half-pixie and half.... whatever Father Christmas is, she's completely determined to get a job at The Order and be independent. When she realizes she can kill two birds with one stone (getting said job and getting Liam his Christmas wish of seeing his uncle) she cajoles, pleads and finally gets her way: she will stay and babysit Ryan through the holidays. She was sassy, impertinent and lots of fun, while also kick ass and caring.

As expected when a pixie wants to get her way, things get a little out of hand, plans go awry and Ryan and Winter soon realize their attraction and chemistry are not as fightable as they thought.

Father Christmas is a lot less like the Hallmark stereotype we know and love and a lot more like Odin, the one-eyed Norse god. His daughter Winter is half-pixie and desperate to get a real job with the Order of the Shadow Accords, the organisation that polices the supernatural world. When Father Christmas refuses to help Liam Ryan with his request for his uncle John to come home for Christmas (because he is too old and swore too much), Winter decides to take matters into her own hands.

John Ryan is having a very bad Christmas. First he was attacked by werewolves and left for dead, then his friends from the Order decided the only way to save his life was to make him a vampire, so now he's some monstrous vampire/werewolf hybrid (BTW they are called Dhamphirs) and no-one knows whether he is safe so his best friend is hovering around him ALL THE TIME.

When Winter finds out that Liam's uncle works for the Order she thinks she can kill two birds with one stone and manages to wangle a job babysitting John Ryan whilst his best friend spends Christmas with his wife, but her attempts to manoeuvre John into seeing Liam backfire hideously when John is ambushed.

This reminds me of the early Sookie Stackhouse books, with vampires and shifters and secret orders and pixies, all mixed up with Christmas and a teen boy's letter to Santa. It was silly and funny and heart-warming all at once. I would be interested to see where Nina Croft takes this series and whether the novels can live up to the delightful nonsense of this holiday novella.

Being the youngest in her family has made Winter a very sheltered girl. Working for the Order of the Shadow Accords, an organization that polices the supernatural, would be a dream come true for her. But her father is crazy overprotective and has shot down the idea too many times already.

While helping her dad (who just so happens to be Father Christmas himself) Winter comes across a heartbreaking Christmas wish from a lonely boy asking for the only family he has left, his Uncle John. When her father dismisses the boy's wishes, Winter steps in to once and for all prove her father wrong and show him she has what it takes to join the Order. She'll make this boy's wish come true and in exchange her father will finally allow her to seek a job within the Order.

This was a very good story. I liked both Winter and Ryan and was happy with how they got together. This is the first story I've read by this author and I liked it well enough that I'm likely to try more of her work in the future. Obviously, I haven't read the other books in this series but this one worked fine as a standalone.

Winter is the daughter of Father Christmas and a Pixie mother that took off on her when she was only 4. Winter has been working for her father but she wants to do something with more meaning and has been trying to get a chance at a postilion within the "Order".

John Ryan (he goes by Ryan) was a human cop that was brought into the Order to act as a human liaison when the supernatural creatures eventually come out to the public. The Werewolves weren't too pleased with that plan and attacked him right before last Christmas to try to kill him. Instead, the other members of the Order turned him Vampire to save his life but it left him as a Vampire/Werewolf hybrid which is so rare, no one knows how to handle Ryan.

As the description indicates, Ryan's nephew, Liam, writes to Father Christmas wishing for his Uncle to be around for Christmas. Father Christmas knows that Ryan works for the Order and figures it's an impossible task. Winter isn't willing to accept that and makes a deal with her father that if she can reunite Ryan and Liam, he'll endorse her when she applies to work for the Order. Piers (who's a close friend with her father and heads up the Order) greets her when she arrives at the Order and she finds out that they need someone to stay with Ryan. He's in control but because vamp/were hybrids are so rare, the fact that he hasn't lost control actually worries them and they want someone watching him just in case.

Since most everyone at the Order wants to leave for the holidays, Winter is tasked with "body-guarding" (aka babysitting) Ryan over the holiday. Winter thinks this is a grand idea as it will give her time to get Ryan to contact his nephew. There's a strong attraction between them and they don't act on it at first but it does happen eventually. Things actually go pretty smoothly but some trouble pops up in the form of the werewolves that previously tried to kill Ryan, which puts them both in danger and gives Winter a chance to actually be a bodyguard. There's some definite danger and a bit of drama but things do get handled. In the end, things work out nicely, with Winter and Ryan together and working their way towards a HEA.

This was a very enjoyable story. I liked Winter as the heroine. She was a bit whimsical (?, not sure if that's the perfect word) at times but she was half-pixie so I guess it was to be expected and with Ryan's more dower attitude, she helped balance him. I really liked how she was able to bring Ryan out of his head and get him to live a bit. REVIEW: 3.75 stars--BITTERSWEET CHRISTMAS is instalment 3.5 in Nina Croft's contemporary, adult THE ORDER paranormal/ fantasy romance series focusing on the men and women who work for The Order of the Shadow Accords- an organization that polices the supernaturals of the world. This is half-pixie Winter, and former human, now a vampire/werewolf John Ryan 's story line. BITTERSWEET CHRISTMAS can be read as a stand alone without any difficulty. Any important information from the previous story lines is revealed where necessary.

Told from dual third person perspectives (Winter and John) BITTERSWEET CHRISTMAS finds our heroine tasked with 'babysitting' the recently turned John Ryan, a man who struggles with the beast within; a vampire/werewolf hybrid whose wolf has yet to come to the surface. Hoping to gain a position within the Order, Winter offers herself up as bodyguard and protector of the one-time human cop, a position she abuses, as she battles between her heart and what she is tasked to do.

One year earlier John Ryan killed the wolf-pack alpha, and in the ensuing time a price has been placed on our hero's head. In hiding for his own protection, and the protection of others, John has all but abandoned his fifteen year old nephew Liam, a young man he took guardianship of upon the teen's mother's death. A letter to Santa finds Liam Ryan asking for the return of the uncle he hasn't seen in months-a letter that finds its way to Winter and her father who happens to be Father Christmas, among other names. What ensues is the building relationship between Winter and John Ryan, and the potential fall out when John's whereabouts are revealed to those hunting him down as Winter ensures Liam's Christmas wish is answered.

BITTERSWEET CHRISTMAS is a sexy paranormal Christmas tale; a quick read; a story of insta-lust with limited sex scenes due in part to the nature of a novella. The premise is sweet and edgy; the characters are colorful and spirited; the romance is intimate without the use of over the top, sexually graphic language and text. For fans of the series, it has been approximately three years since the author last released a title in The Order series but many will recognize John Ryan from his previous involvement as well as the return of Piers Lamont, vampire and head of the Order of the Shadow Accords.
