It was almost as if the author had actually tried a little too hard to produce a novel that was as good as the first one that she had written, a series that would reach out to her authors like the beautiful dead. I think that's the problem with a lot of authors, they have success with the first series and then push themselves too hard to make the next series of books as successful and it never ever works. It is a shame because I actually feel that she has a lot more to offer than was shown here within the novel.

Of course, it was not a totally negative novel, the idea behind it was a good one and I think that perhaps with a little more work upon it, it could be the fully effective story that it needed to be in order to really grasp its readers and make them see everything that it had to offer. I think this is why I am offering the book a mere two star rating. it had potential but just didn't meet the criteria like it should have done which really was just a shame.
