Montmorency's Revenge by Eleanor Updale is a mystery and historical fiction book. Since this is the fourth book of the series, I thought this book wouldn't be as good as others because I have this mindset that second to the last book of the series is the worst. The reason is probably because it is the "transition" of the series,

where it just builds up suspension for the last novel. However, this book broke the fixed mindset with the interesting character relationships and the suspenseful plot. I would rate this novel as the best in the series.

It starts out with the dark, gloomy mood, where Montmorency and his friends are seeking revenge on the two antagonists: one who killed insane Queen Victoria and one who killed Montmorency's best partner, George. Meanwhile, there is Doctor Fawcett, who became after his lover's death because of his x-ray experiments on her, to develop an amazing invention. They decide to chase after the antagonists, by using special codes, disguise, and even came up with the idea of getting the crazy doctor involved. Will they be able to work as a team and succeed in capturing the enemies?

Overall, with the interesting character development and exhilaration during chases, I think it was a good book to read. There are few plot twists, which turns the table for the main characters' chase. Also, there are many characters involved, which makes it confusing time to time, but other times more interesting, with different perspectives. I also think the author did really well on the last part with the plot-twist that made me agitated and have goosebumps.
