Kendra is approached by an old friend, one of her teachers before her eyesight was restored. Janice says that her fiancee is missing. She went over to his house, the door had been kicked open, blood is everywhere, and all his things, including his car are still there.

She reported this to the police, but now no one is returning her calls. She went back to the house to get a few of her things, but the house has been sanitized. There's a new door ..all their things are gone and there is no blood anywhere.

The lead investigator now tells her there was no sign of a break-in and they are assuming he just up and left.

So what is going on? Why are the police lying? What are they covering up? And where is her fiancee? Is he even still alive?

If you've read any part of this series, you will like this one. It's a fast, easy read short story (less than 50

pages) but it emphasizes Kendra's abilities. If you haven't read any of the series, I would not recommend starting here. Start with Book 1 and work through the current 5 books.
