Firstly I think it is best to mention it can be read as a stand alone, but I feel it is best to read the first book, sadly I did not and I think it would have made this book better.

A slow burning crime thriller that does have three great characters in Kal, Marty and Sophie but for me was a little slow especially around the middle of the book, finished off with a good pace with the last two chapters.

The main problem I had was why?

Why would you just help a young girl you do not know?

Although I enjoyed the main characters, just the pace of the book.

EXCERPT: I suppose the realization I was different stole up on me slowly.

There were signs from early on, if I 'm honest. Like my first year in primary school when Mirabella wet her knickers in front of the whole class - the girls were mortified and the boys laughed and I was excited.

So, yeah, I knew I was different. To survive, I learned to act like my friends and I 'm so good, pretty much everyone in my life would say I'm normal and I like that because it means I'm clever.

One thing I've learned is that when you've wanted something for a long time, your mind makes tracks in the sand showing exactly how it's going to turn out. You anticipate your own excitement, your own arousal, and what the other person will say and do. Those tracks start out delicate and then solidify with each replaying of the fantasy, until they get to be as firm as a rail track. The fantasy can keep me occupied for months only, at some point, I have to have the real deal - the flash of horror in their eyes, the desperate urge to plead for mercy, bowels voiding and dribbling down a leg. It's the helplessness that grabs me - when they realize there's absolutely nothing they can do. It's the best drug in the world.

And with me, it's the eyes that are captivating. The windows of the soul - unable to lie in the final moments.

MY THOUGHTS: I hadn't read Kal Medi #1 before reading London Noir by Ann Girdharry. I think it would have helped, as there are numerous references to events that occurred in that first book that are not

adequately explained, like what had happened to put Marty in hospital in a coma or why Kal was in the grip of the London Cartel. So I don't really recommend this as a stand alone book. But if you do read London Noir without reading Good Girl, Bad Girl, then chances are you will do what I am doing, and lay your hands on a copy of #1 anyway.

Ann Girdharry had me hooked from the beginning. In fact at the 7% mark my comment was 'WOW!'. Of course, this frenetic pace could not be maintained although London Noir continued to be a fast paced book and a quick read. And while I didn't always find Kal's actions believable or at all rational, I was happy to suspend belief and just enjoy the read.

As a second in a series book, I wish I had followed my normal rule of reading series in order. I seem to be veering from this rule a lot lately and finding myself frustrated in the process. There were definitely moments where I felt reading the first in the series, Good Girl Bad Girl, would've helped answered some questions that weren't answered in this book. How exactly did Marty end up in the hospital? How did Kal end up so "different" and part of the London cartel? While I applaud the author for not wasting numerous pages reflecting on these as I typically don't like that when I read a series in order... it would've been helpful

here since I broke my own rule - again, my own fault! It didn't take away too much away from my reading of this one but I would suggest that if you want to pick this thriller up, that you start with the first book.

During the first few chapters I was a bit confused of Kal's motivation. Why would she go out of her way to put herself in danger to help Sophie? She barely knew her and did the good deed by taking her where she wanted to go - regardless if it wasn't the "safest" of places. Her instant reaction to putting herself in danger numerous times for not so reasonable reasons kept me scratching my head. Once I decided to just suspend that part of it, I became engaged in the story. This book is action packed, suspenseful and fast paced. All things I love in a good thriller.

The writing was easy to read though I did feel sometimes the dialogue became a bit stunted and lacked in consistency. "I like you." "I like you too." However, I will say that it did read easier as the story progressed.

One thing I do love is that you can tell the author used her experience as a psychotherapist throughout the novel. It was apparent in how Sophie was portrayed, reactions to medications and how a clinic was well represented. I can fully appreciate everything she did with all of these things.

Overall a great thriller - I may need to get book one to get more knowledge on the background of some of the characters which I think will make things make a tad more sense with the main character, Kal, and why she did things the way that she did.

After reading book 1 some time ago I was happy to receive this book 2 to catch up with things. Its not a quick fast paced read. I did find some of things that Kat did or said a bit irrational at times but hey ho, shes a woman right. Nevertheless, as a rational woman myself it did leave me humfing at times.

Kat runs to her car and begins driving, its wet weather and on route she almost runs over a young woman. This woman's name is Sophie.

After finding our if shes OK, she is still worried about this stranger named Sophie and offers her a lift to her home.

But, Sophie doesn't want to be dropped off at home, she wants to be dropped off at an undesirable red light district.

That is where my high hopes dropped a bit as I didn't feel this realistic, well, not something I would have done, but you need to draw your own conclusions here.

Then Kat later discovers there is a killer on the loose and the women he has killed are connected with Sophie, so now she is even more worried about her.

Get ready for some tummy churning moments as the killers gory happenings are unfolded and described in horrific detail upon the pages.

My personal thoughts are that some things were hard to believe, some things needed more pace and pitch and power. I didn't find it a page turner, I did find it a slow burner and not an edge of your seat thriller, and sometimes that's a good thing.

The plot was a good one but the way Sophie was introduced and how Kat was so 'worried' about a stranger was so hard for me to understand fully.
