Kathleen says

Anne Stuart is apparently branching into erotica or romantica, but surely she can do better than this? I'd say she's playing to her *Ice Series* fans, but *Risk the Night* is a pale imitation of *Black Ice*, even though the hero is hot and dark and some scenes are captivating. In my view, it's under-developed and poorly edited. With only ~50 pages, a dozen typos is too many.

Plot: Set in Paris, *Risk the Night* involves **Madison Banks**, a well-connected reporter, and **Constantine (aka D'Angelo)**, an assassin who agrees to give Maddy a scoop (as a favor to his friend) as long as her interview takes place in the dark, and blindfolded. During the interview, there in the small dark room, they immediately feel an intense attraction. The story goes from there, with POVs from the H and h.

My Take:

Even with a shorter story, and even with erotica, I want a sense of developing relationship and emotional intimacy. Including trust. Especially trust. That was lacking. I could accept the instant attraction, the torrid sex, but not the grand all-for-love gesture at the end. But, hey! The sex scenes were HOT! D'Angelo knows his way around a woman. And his dramatic appearance...nicely done!

Towards the end, a stupid murder / suicide is suddenly tacked on, as if to provide the Stuart stamp of authenticity, but the H / h didn't seem very interested. That struck a jarring note.

Maddy, our supposedly discerning and intelligent heroine, does something absurdly foolish. Also, she cheats on her near-fiancé. The hero is cheating on his girl, too, but they had a loose relationship.

For a few shining, spine-chilling pages I wondered what Stuart was up to. That bit felt like *Ice Blue*, in terms of suspense.

The final HEA conclusion is totally improbable. Yet I sorta liked it. Go figure. (I liked his line, "...I may as well keep you.")

Trivia: Stuart names one character Thomas Lambert, which may be concocted from Thomas Killian and Isobel Lambert, H/h in *Ice Storm*, book 4 of the *Ice* series.

Small potatoes, but I don't like it when authors allude to a character from literature or film, and then turn around and explain the reference. That ruins the effect, and smacks of condescension.

For erotica with an edge of romantic suspense, I prefer Lisa Marie Rice. I really enjoyed *Dangerous Passion*. She also writes as Elizabeth Jennings.

(Feb) This was a down and dirty quick Anne Stuart story. Constantine is an unabashed hit man, who is forced to do a favor for a friend - sit down, in a dark room, with a reporter who will ask questions about his job. During the interview, he gets...I don't know, a sense, maybe...of the woman reporter, and somehow a sexual spark is lit, sight unseen, anonymous though the interview is. Constantine might be able to forget her, but later that night, in the guise of a indolent playboy at a high end party, he sees a woman and knows it is his mystery reporter. Maddy, our reporter, has a boyfriend, but she too felt the sexual frisson between her and her secret interviewee, but does not make the connection when a sexy playboy with an accent approaches her at the embassy party. He gives her a lift home, and she goes home, feeling out of sorts, thinking about her boyfriend, and feeling uncomfortably aroused. She is unprepared yet not really surprised when the playboy shows up at her place, seduces her up all night - until she somehow (women's intuition?!) realizes that sexy playboy = dangerous sexy mystery hitman. As with most vintage AS gamma hero books, you don't really see the love, yet you don't really doubt it, and you believe that they will ride off into their HEA - assuming the hero does not kill her along the way!

Whew! Anne Stuart knows how to write romance—the steamy, passionate, toe-curling kind—and in novella form to boot. This is a challenging format to master, yet I find Anne's evocative but sparse writing style (she uses minimal words to evoke atmosphere) and vivid characterizations pair nicely with this format.

Anyway, I loved the sexy and dangerous hero; liked the heroine; and absorbed the hot sex and romantic ending with warm, fuzzy feelings. Constantine's and Maddy's interactions weren't as extensive as they would be in a full-length novel, but the chemistry between them was compelling enough to suggest their whirlwind romance would last.

Short and sexy, this is a keeper!

Now that I am done with the gush...I will begin with my warnings. First off, if you haven't read Anne Stuart and have never been introduced to the assassins that she calls "heroes", I would NOT suggest starting with this book. Her ICE series would be a great place to start and get your feet wet. Unless you can tolerate and, dare I say, fall for Bastian from Black Ice, Peter from Cold As Ice, Taka from Ice Blue, Serafin from Ice Storm, and Reno from Fire And Ice. You ***are. not. ready.*** for Constantine.

Second of all, these heroes are not for everyone. They are not nice men and do not act the way that nice men do. You have to see beyond their words and thoughts. Many times with these "heroes", what makes you realize that they love the heroine is that they **can not kill them!** . This is hard for many readers to swallow, but for me...I can not get enough of them!

This book is crazy! It is set in Paris and will lead you through a night that could only be possible within the pages of a brilliantly written Anne Stuart book. I read somewhere that this novella was supposed to be an addition to the ICE series, and it certainly belongs there. Constantine is an ice cold legitimate killer who is starting to show signs of humanity. It is clear that he is growing weary of all the killing and one incredibly hot night with Maddy is enough to make me believe that even the darkest of souls can get their HEA.

This book's sensuality is off the charts. Not erotica. Not kink. Pure sensuality in it's truest form. I have read just about everything, and Anne Stuart can hit buttons inside me that no whips, chains, or ropes could ever touch.
