Others will tell you the story, so I'm going to talk about craft here. The pacing at the beginning was a little slow. While I was reading the first two or three chapters I felt that there was too much backstory. A little while later, by chapter 4 or 5, that paid off when I felt like, oh, I understand what this means to the character.

However, by chapter 6 I was skipping whole paragraphs, reading just the first line of four or five paragraphs in a row to get to the next interesting part (even during sex scenes). I was reminded of Elmore Leonard's assertion that he always tried to write only the parts that readers wouldn't skip. I'm not sure how this author managed to write so many skippable parts in such a short novel. The parts I read, I liked. The story itself was good. I liked the characters. But I skipped about five chapters and only read the last three and didn't feel like I missed anything.
