I have not loved a book and a series this much since 2014 when I first read Cassndara Clare/The Mortal Instruments.

I liked this approach because not many authors make a character "evil" and make them even question their positions later on. Throughout the book, River would be put in situations where he had to chose between the witches or Kamzin's side of the battle. This back and forth battle of his conscious of where to stand was a great touch to his character. River was not evil like Esha and the other witches which clearly can be seen. River made a stupid action, but he did what he felt was right later realizing it had a benefit, but also has consequences. River is really a lost soul at times just trying to find his place in the world and I don't think he knew how to properly show a humane side, at times, or how to express emotions well. After that epic betrayal and high emotion roller coaster in book 1, I expected an equally epic reconciliation between Kamzin & River. I was left disappointed in that aspect. I wanted anger, so much anger and hurt. And heart. I wanted heartfelt words and high emotions, but all we really got from River was some vague amusement and interest.

I just needed more for him after the glimpses of compassion and fear we saw in book 1. The love story was lack luster and thrust forward with a feeling that will leave you feeling disappointed "wait, that's it? Just like that?" In sorry it was incredibly bland and lackluster.

And maybe that's just not how River and Kamzin operate, but after accomplishing great characterizations and world building in EtDS, I was expecting to be on the edge of my seat, not a rapid regression on both fronts. It seems to me that Fawcett tried to write in too much plot in too few pages. As a result, the characters are bland and every plot is left unfinished. I think this needed to be a trilogy.

The plot will remind you a bit of the movie based on Neil Gaiman's novel, *Stardust*, so if you liked that, you'll probably be into this sequel

The race is on, will the Witches or the Azmiri Trio (Kamzin, Lusha, and Tem) reach the star and claim it's powers first?

With Azar-at at her side, Kamzin struggles to find the line between using the fire demon's magic too much as well as too little. Constantly at odds with her sister, Lusha, we see into Kamzin's thoughts and her resentment towards her sister. Unfortunately, nothing ever comes of that, which is a bit frustrating, given how much Lusha aggravated Kamzin. I was waiting for them to hash it out, but they never did. They *do* have each other's backs, *always*, but I never really understood why. They're always at odds but fiercely loyal to each other. Lusha, especially carries out her own agendas without consulting Kamzin, frequently. It is a point of tension that is never addressed.

We get some more myth about this world. Wind demons are introduced but we never truly get the full story, since not much is known, even in the books, but I wanted to know more.

For how big a role Lusha played, I find it hard to believe she didn't get a POV when even Mara, who I felt just barely accepted tolerance towards, got a POV. There is so much going on with Lusha behind the scenes and In her head , it begged to be explored

All the wondering light, like it's predecessor, is insanely well written, despite my grievances with the lack of emotion portrayed on all fronts from all characters. We are taken into an adventure once again on icy mountains of death, chasing a myth, fighting witches, and playing the part at court.

There is so much left un-answered. SO MUCH.

I can only hope that Fawcett is planning a spin off series which addresses:

1. What comes of the blossoming romance between Lusha & the Emperor
2. who *is* Ragtooth, *really*?
3. How does River really feel about being ousted from the court and life he fell into so easily. Did he feel want regret in losing a friend in the Emperor? Did he ever consider them friends. What is going on inside his head? Why did he decide to choose to follow Kamzin above all else?
4. River is the King of the witches- doesn't that have to be addressed even *a little bit*? Witches going into hiding was just not enough of an answer.

My hope is that we get spin-off that follows A future daughter of River and Kamzin (given they need stronger shaman's with witch blood in the world anyway) that take us on a journey to understand more of the mythology and gives a peek into the lives of old characters, hopefully addressing all the questions left unanswered, and a final resolution for witches and humans both.

I will accept nothing but bad-assery and repentance in this book. Kamzin. River. I SHIP THEM. SO. HARD.
