Awakenings is a Gay For You or GFY story about two college roommates who gradually got to know each other, got used to each other, and basically just fell for each other. These two men were poles opposite and yet they fit perfectly.

This is set in a college campus where both Ben and Solomon, or Solo, are roommates. There is no mention of a fraternity so I am not sure about that. The story starts out with both young men already very comfortable with the other so there is no insecurity on that end. When Ben and Solo start doing things beyond what straight guys usually do when there are no girls around, it starts out with little discomfort which made Solo question himself and their relationship. Ben is so secure in his masculinity that he can shed his clothes without modesty be it in the privacy of his room or outside the dorm. Solo cannot but keep his eyes on his friend and soon has thoughts that (he thinks) he should be ashamed of (but is really not). Ben is not helping as he just keeps being who he is and continues to instigate some encounters that both young men wholeheartedly jump into. Their verbal sparring is quite revealing and yet Solo tries half-heartedly tries to ignore it and epically fails. It was not a surprise when others looked at them and immediately concluded they were a couple.

This is a very short and light read and yet I really loved it, especially as these two men reminded me so much of two friends in college who were straight as arrows, ran naked on the grounds most times even when the

snow was falling and were considered as the bestest of friends. I had concluded then they were a couple but their fraternity brothers always denied it. But more so to fit in with what his friends in school were doing. When he gets to college he and his roommate instantly click and become best friends. Just normal guy stuff at the start. But then Solo finds himself noticing Ben more and more, little things, like the fact that Ben prefers being naked to clothed.

Ben is an exhibitionist of sorts, at least where his roommate is concerned. I don't think he intentionally tried to get a rise out of Solo. He's just not ashamed of his body and enjoys the attention that people pay it. Over time though something grows inside him. He finds himself attracted to Solo. Where the two have always been very flirtatious by nature, it's never been a serious attraction or invitation to Solo to pursue. Jayson James writing style is not for everyone. It's very raw, realistic and young at heart. While there were a

few things lacking here and there throughout the story, overall I loved the way these characters were portrayed. And for the reviewers complaining about the lack of sex, you do realize that James writes Gay YA, don't you? Not every book in the genre has to be full of lust and passion. Sometimes young men are just getting their footing and wrapping their brain around their attraction to another guy.

My appreciation for the author's efforts aside, however, this story just did not work for me. I love a college-aged GFY as much as the next girl, and I found the idea behind a character who self-identifies as asexual finally experiencing a sexual awakening for that one special person (a sexy man, of course!) intriguing. Unfortunately, all of that was laid out in the prompt and it was the overall execution of the story that I found lacking.

While both likable enough, I didn't find that either Solo or Ben drew me in and demanded that I become invested in them or their relationship. There just weren't enough deeply emotional and angsty or sweet and gooey moments between the characters to build that sense of connection between them and me, and I found the constant stripteases awkward and repetitive. So, when the story ended with (view spoiler), I just kinda \*shrugged\* and moved on.

I think my biggest difficulty with the story was that the narration and the dialogue seemed overly formal for a story about two college guys in their early twenties. It was also the exact same voice for both characters, so you couldn't always distinguish which one was talking at any given moment. The lack of contractions and overly concise use of language made the story feel stiff and stilted - like the story had been edited within an inch of its life.

I believe the author's relatively new to the publishing world, though, and may find a more relaxed, natural rhythm to his writing with time and experience.
