I will start this review by saying that I won this book through a goodreads giveaway.

When I started reading this book, I thought it was very interesting. The characters were dynamic, the settings were well described, and the overall content made sense and wasn't hard to follow.

However, as the story continued and as you reached mid-way through the novel, it felt as if the story was being dragged out for no particular reason. I find the author described things too much in detail, and repeated them a lot (how the author described what the character wore almost every single day and it was always the same description...white shirt, plaid skirt etc..)

I also find that there were added scenarios that didn't make much of a difference to the plot and storyline which made the book super long for no reason. It is almost a 500 page book! Most of the time I felt like skipping a couple pages because it felt draining and too long to read through. I find it could have been shortened and the readers would have gotten the same effect from it since there was a lot of added detail and scenes that did not contribute to the plot, therefore were unnecessary.

But, I must say that the author did a very well job in describing the spiritual aspect of this book such as the energy flows, meditation and enlightening process. They are very complicating aspects to explain to people who aren't aware of enlightenment or spirituality, so I did find that the author did a great job at creating a story about it which was actually very interesting in context, therefore I do applaud her for that.

She did redeem herself nearing the end of the book as well, it was really just the prolonged middle part that could have been better adapted. Because the ending was not dragged on, and there was a nice plot twist that added suspense and made you want to keep reading until the very end.
