The Dangers of a Lack of Proofreading

For a story like this to be a five-star, it has to be well-researched, carefully laid out, and contain strong characters driven by a logical plot (with great steamy scenes).

The lack of proofreading was evident, and distracting. Throughout, I had to keep rereading sentences to discern meaning (and change a word, mentally). Similarly, researchable inconsistencies detracted from its overall believability.

The star and the upcoming star is a great trope, and these two had potential. It strayed into "street garbage" a little, with the slang and youth-culture concepts putting it in a more urban niche. Missed opportunities for deepening characters abound, substituted instead for marginally gratuitous, slightly repetitive, steamy scenes.

This isn't a negative review, and I will read more work by this author...I think they need to be more careful with their texts in future.
