I had never heard of Bob's Burgers before this, since the show isn't on TV here in Finland. As a sitcom series this so reminded me of the Simpsons and Family Guy and I never found those funny either. Same thing with

Bob's Burgers really. The comic consists of smaller stories around jokes and whatnot. They aren't really linked to one another, which makes the comic sporadic. Also, none of the characters were introduced and the same thing with the setting and all. Thus the comic is really closely tied to the animation series and doesn't have a life of its own. This eats the comic's value and it's hard to approach, if you know nothing about it. The whole thing smells of an addition merchandise. It takes ages before the comic even goes to the point of the burger place being in the center, which was confusing. Same thing when you know nothing about the characters - their choices and whatnot have no point whatsoever.

The art is not to my liking and even the colors hurt eyes from time to time. The panels are stuffed and even the panel backgrounds look like someone puked rainbows all over the place. The Simpsons like simplicity would work better. Why do all the American sitcom animations look alike? Why do they recycle the same jokes? I don't even know to whom this comic was meant, since it was childish and at the same time too boring for kids. Structure-wise this works OK, but that's almost like the only thing that works. This is an okay collection, but I'm a little disappointed. This book includes 5 issues.

Each character gets their own little segment per issue, which is kind of cool. Unfortunately, Bob and Linda's pieces were really small and kind of uninteresting. It's a shame because while Louise is my favorite character, part of what makes the show so hilarious is Bob and Linda's couple dynamic. I mean, it is called Bob's Burgers, not Bob's Kids' Burgers. I wish the focus was taken away from the kids a little bit and was more encompassing.

Tina's stories were hit and miss. Tina's awkward, obviously, that's part of what makes her hilarious. But it was a little too awkward. I got a few laughs, but overall I was left feeling "meh". Louise's were right in the middle. Hers were more action-themed and interesting, and because I like her more as a character, I was a little more forgiving. The best segments were surprisingly Gene's, which were written in rhyme and were absolutely fantastic.

The art was hit and miss as well. Some stories looked really nice, others looked disjointed and off.

Overall, it's worth a look through if you're a fan of the show, but I'd rather watch it. It loses some of the humor when you can't hear it in their voices and mannerisms.
