He returns 2 years later and critically wounded, so that he spends more than half the book in bed with a drunken self-pity party. Gunnar doesn't want Kadlin to " pity" him, but while she's wrapped up in her own pain of living in the past, he pities himself. The whole story is pretty boring except for the second to last chapter, which was a little too descriptive and grisly for my tastes.
