The illustrations are beautiful, and even though they're explicitly sexual at times; they're still tasteful and elegant. The characters are complex and while they're not always acting in entirely likeable ways, there's something that feels incredibly human and believable about them and their situation.

The storyline is interesting and mature, without moving into dullness, and the smut feels purposeful rather than superfluous and like the end goal; there's always a lot more going on, and it's the relationship between the characters, and the between-the-lines actions that speak louder than words at the end of the day.

My only complaint is that it seems that Youka Nitta has ended things here: it feels incomplete and like there was a lot more storyline waiting to happen. But even in light of this, it still deserves five stars for what it is... which is absolutely brilliant.
