I think this is one of my favorite pieces that I had to read in high school. The story about *Albertine* caused such a huge reaction when it was realized, that that in itself made me love this book. Why? This was released in 1886 and since it stirred up a HUGE controversy at that time, it makes you think what exactly is so horrible?

Albertine was a poor girl from Kristiania (today's Oslo) who one night gets called over to the police chief named Winther. She was served some drinks, passed out and woke up to the sight of being raped.

The theme in the book is prostitution and how the people of a higher class really was and how they were treating those who were below them. I remember my teacher once told us that this book was banned shortly after it was released and that it wasn't banned because of the prostitution (oh, *Albertine* also had a sister who was a prostitute, aw :/), but because it reflected a bad image upon the wealthier class at that time.

The incident that occurred that one night, basically changed *Albertine*. She started following her sister's footsteps, which really is just sad. At first I got the impression that *Albertine* was a sweet girl, but that completely changed throughout the story.

I kind of understand why there was a huge fuss about this book at the time of its release, but I like it. Christian Krohg, as well as many other writers who had the guts, really captured the truth of the society and its flaws.

It's a book that's worth reading. I'm so glad that we had to both read and learn about it at school!
