He is convinced to act as the heir's double as the land is turbulent and assassination is feared. Mostly due to the fact that the Baron is unduly strict and partially mad. Conan wanders about as the double, learning that he doesn't much care for courtly life and intrigue, until neighboring Baron's arrive to seek assistance in stopping an uprising of the Cult of Set. A great battle ensues.

Conan spends the first 2/3 of the book learning how to act as a nobleman, taking lessons in courtly manners and not doing overly well. When not in school he washes pots and cleans things. All along the snake cult is out there, much like the White Walkers in Game of Thrones, mentioned often but rarely seen. Not until the end does Conan get to do much of anything. If you want to learn about court intrigue in a land ruled by a mad family then this is for you. If You want to see Conan do something other than sneak about and occasionally wench then you'll be disappointed.
