I was attracted to this particular book because, well, I definitely have a fireman kink. Who doesn't? Four years in a row, my blessed mother bought me the WA Fireman calendar, and went and met them to get it signed. That's motherly love, I tell you. So that was part of my interest, and the other part involved baking. I love to bake, it's where I get the most creative.

Alex, aka Dumbass Bakery Guy, according to Kevin, rushed back into his burning building to get his dog, wouldn't listen to Kevin, and now, Kevin is stuck doing desk duty until his captain clears him. Kevin is a little, wait, make that a lot, pissed. This is his third assignment in two years, and if he can't make it here, there may not be a fourth one. He is a third generation firefighter in the city, and his dad is deputy chief. No wonder Kevin is as far in the closet as he is. Don't Ask, Don't Tell is alive and well at Kevin's parents' home. Whereas Alex has never hidden who he is, or whom he loves, even when he probably should've, at times. Alex, and his bakery, are a neighborhood fixture, known for his generous donations and charity work. Even though these two very different men shoot off a few sparks after meeting, they definitely despise each other, which, of course, makes it all the more entertaining.

With his kitchen and all of the stock destroyed, Alex won't be able to make his annual gingerbread house

which is donated for the Home Sweet Home charity auction. Home Sweet Home helps match foster kids with prospective adoptive parents, a service which is very near and dear to Alex's heart. Alex is stunned when the guys at Station 7 tell him he can use their industrial kitchen to get the gingerbread house done. Now all he has to do is stay out of Kevin's way. Turns out, that's a lot harder to do than he thought.

I've got to be honest and admit that I didn't much like Kevin, and pretty much everything Alex accused him of being, I completely agreed with. He came around, obviously, in the end, but I still didn't connect as well with him. Alex, however, I simply adored. He was a wonderful character, and personally I think way too good for Kevin. *grins* This was most definitely, another cute and fun novella, which I can easily recommend.

Of the stories in the series, this was the most clicked with me. Like previous books, this novella could be read as standalone. The only tie-in between each books were the mentions of MC or their brand from others in the series.

This is the very first E.M. Lynley I have read. So I really had no idea what to expect in terms of writing style. The works had been recommended to me by friends so I took this chance. And there are no regrets. However, it was a style I was not used to. It is a plot that I found a bit formulaic at first until.....

The books starts off with a fire and it is bringing down the bakery of a very popular baker of the area. Alex had been known throughout as someone who is not only talented, but he has a heart of gold. The bakery going up in flames threatened the one thing the people were looking out for every year: gingerbread.

Kevin comes from a long line of men and women in the service of the community as either cops or firefighters. However, he is new to this area so was not knowledgeable of who Alex was or what he represented. The only thing he knows is this: this guy went inside a burning building for he forgot he had been dog sitting a friend's dog. Calling him an idiot did not start the relationship well and from there on out, it just continued to crumple and become dirt. A complication did happen: they had a bit of sexual stint in the firehouse and well, let's just say, it resulted to mutual satisfaction of the physical kind and nothing else. It also resulted to the worsening of a relationship. Or, acquaintanceship.

It was quite hard reading these two men. Alex was kind of closed and Kevin was kind of a jerk. Seriously. These two men could never be considered compatible. In any way. This made me rethink my decision to read this story. I did not want to read about two -----*%\$#^&----- and end with a happy ending.

Imagine my surprise when I could not put this down. I just about wanted to hit myself. Why was I so interested with this two men?
