He's spent fifteen years trying to find her while becoming a famous football player. He's ready to marry Jill and take in his son, but Jill sure isn't sure.

While trying for suspense, there ended up being a few plot threads that weren't tied very up well. And the sex scenes were just - well, creepy is the only word I can come up with.
