I really liked this story. Partly because one of the main characters, Joseph, is a writer and I was able to identify with his reactions to reviews, and to seeing his newest book in the store. But mostly I liked it because of the way Joseph and Lee, who is a school teacher, were true partners. They supported each other through the tough bits (bad reviews for Joseph, an outbreak of swine flu at Lee's school), each making the other see reason when it got difficult. A very nice read.

I always love C.B. Potts. I think there are at least two things that work well here. First is the strong relationship between the two main characters, Joseph and Lee. Joseph needs support when his new novel receives a lousy review. Then Ms. Potts does a good job of showing the vast chasm between disappointment of a review and true emotional pain when one of Lee's students is seriously ill. That leads to the second device that works here: I think there's often some resistance to gay men teaching at elementary schools or high schools, but Ms. Potts shows that sometimes teachers who can't or don't have their own children are a lot more deeply invested in their students than what's typical, and that's a refreshing realization. As usual, she has a lot of clever dialogue that will leave you with a smile. :)
