The moments that spoke to me personally were:

Ok, no surprise that the first one was about names - from p33f - *God assigned Adam the task of naming all the animals (see Gen. 2:19). Names had much richer meaning in those days because they represented the nature of something. I believe that Adam was actually assigning to each animal its nature, its realm of authority and the dimension of glory it would enjoy. In reality, Adam's assignment was to help define the nature of the world he was to live in.*

Second one should be no surprise either, since it is tangentially related to my own name - from p62 - barrenness, such as Hannah's, is not to get us to strategise our way into the promise but to cause us to be desperate enough to seek God.

Third one - p 81f - the story of the roadrunner which loved to worship and was found dead by Jason after becoming startled and hurtling into a plate glass window.
