I really enjoyed this novel which I received as a Goodreads Firstreads. Amelia Drakos is a marine biologist who has spent decades conducting research in a Rhode Island oceanography lab. Her life starts to spiral when the grants she depends on are refused. This puts her career goals and financial status in jeopardy including her home. Her only son that she financed through college has now moved out of state and is starting on a new life and career. The strong bond she has with her two lab partners is in jeopardy as they may all need to find new jobs in different locations. What she doesn't need is a letter from a lawyer in the Great Lakes region ultimately leading to the discovery that her now deceased father had another family. She has a half brother who is part of the Native American Council and a wildlife biologist intent on saving the wolves from the newly reinstated wolf hunts. Hopes of a friendly meeting with her brother are dashed as he struggles with his own issues with abandonment by their father. Another hurdle to overcome.

What entails is a story of a woman rediscovering herself, a new life, and struggling to adapt to the upheaval caused by these stressors. The characters in this novel are strong and enduring.

I also liked learning about the marine biologists' lives and the wildlife biologists when dealing with preserving the species and environment and the dangers they face in their careers.
