He has tortured himself with questions like this for years and it has slowly torn him apart. He sadly turned to drink and drugs to try and forget.

Chase has now opened his own bar, which has made him very happy. However, he cannot move any further forward with his life until he gets some answers. Why was he taken? Is it because he is gay? A fact that his very own father made him ashamed to be. He has hidden his whole life and even after his father's death, the abduction and subsequent degradation from Ben about being gay, he still cannot bring himself to tell a soul he is gay.
