Eric and Rowen are mesmerized when they finally stand side by side to share their nuptials before the entire wedding party breaks out in chaos and is not only disrupted, but is actually aborted. After sharing information with the investigation, Rowen's cousin, Rose, starts dating the Chief of Police, Ben Williamson.
