Indigo is a plus size fetish model who takes a job as a last minute replacement for Chef Faust. The essence of the job: to serve as a human sushi platter for the night.

Chef Faust sees in Indigo the submissive she never thought she was and requests three days to be make her his.

After a series of tantalizing teases, cooking in the nude and a play party there is a great HEA.

This story was a great read and I really enjoyed it as it combined my favorite topics: erotic romance, BDSM and cooking.

On a funny note, I live in the neighborhood referenced in the book as to where Chef Faust lives.

Book Utopia says

This is actually one of the few times I bought a book for its cover. The woman as Indie (which, by the way, is a pretty good representation of what she's supposed to look like) reminds me of a couple friends, and I was eager to see how a plus-sized heroine with tats, attitude, and unusual looks would fare in an erotic romance. The answer is not too bad.

Indie (short for Indigo) gets a last minute gig as a living platter for a special sushi dinner being thrown by top chef Banner Faust. With her tattoos and blue-streaked hair, not to mention that she's not the size two all the other girls are, she doesn't fit the usual profile, but as she's being hustled off to make-up to airbrush away her tats, she runs into the chef himself, who insists she be left as she is. Not only that, he wants her as his centerpiece, and so she is put on display right where he is working. The two have a brief exchange which ends with Banner making an offer for Indie to think about over the night – the next three days with him as his submissive. He's been without for a long time, and Indie pushes all of his buttons. She, in turn, has always been curious about the lifestyle but never acted on it. Getting to learn something with a guy she admires – she's going to culinary school, too – as well as wants seems like a win/win situation. So she arrives right on time the next morning to begin three days of bliss.

Though I can't say that everything about this novella worked for me, it does have some shining features. Without a shadow of a doubt, the single best part of it is the careful and loving detail given to all the culinary aspects. Since it starts out immediately in a food setting, it provides a strong anchor for the rest of it to build on, with specific details to convince me of the world these characters live in (not to mention really sparking some serious sushi cravings). Some of this attention to detail extends to the BDSM scenes as well, specifically the figging scene the two undergo the first day they're together. While I have a hard time accepting two veritable strangers undergoing such an act so quickly, it was written with a keen eye for realism (like the freezing of the ginger prior to using it).

Indie is another joy in this. It's exciting to read about heroines who don't fit the usual stereotype, and Indie breaks a lot of those molds. She's got a Dita Von Teese flair to her style, though not nearly as sultry kitten in temperament. Indie uses her clothes, make-up, and tattoos to hide behind, a fact Banner picks up on almost right away. I liked her a lot, though I found her a little too quick to trust Banner and not always as non-bratty as she claimed to be. Still, she was strong-willed and resourceful, while still being submissive for him, and lends the story more verisimilitude as a result.

Where the story doesn't work as well for me rests in two distinct areas. First, I didn't fall for Banner. He was charming enough on the outside, but the man I met at the beginning of the story often disappeared throughout. He's not into dominating through rules but rather through emotional control, and ends up coming across more than once as domineering rather than dominant. It's a fine line, especially when a character is professed to be so otherwise tender and caring. His quickness to fall for Indie, too, suggests a more obsessive personality than I think the author intends. He makes the three-day offer specifically because he's afraid of scaring her off by asking for more. For a man who has been out of the scene as long as he is, consumed by his work (even when it's not as satisfying as he wanted it to be), it never felt realistic or organic that he would be so willing to fall head over heels for her so fast. And figging less than twenty-four hours after meeting a girl who has never been in the scene before? I don't think so. He has no idea what kind of boundaries or barriers she might have. He's still learning about her. In my opinion, it's too soon, especially since they hadn't really talked about what was going to happen in their time together by that point.

My other disappointment was in the BDSM aspect itself. Considering the daring personalities of both protagonists, I expected something explosive in their coming together. There's hints of it early on, but too quickly, it boils down into what I consider more BDSM-lite. It's all so very tasteful. Mannered, even. I never felt it combust, which is what really well written BDSM does. I do wonder if this stems from my failure to appreciate Banner as the romantic hero. Without falling for him, it's too easy to become more aware and critical of other aspects. In the end, though, the result is the same. I didn't react to the erotic portions of the story nearly as strongly as I'm sure the author intended.

At this point, I wouldn't actively seek out more work by this author, but on the other hand, because of her clear research and love of unconventional heroines, I won't dismiss it, either. Perhaps I won't have the same difficulties with her next romantic hero.

I decided to read this based upon the review of a friend. It was a really nice change from the previous BDSM books I had read. I think what I liked most is how normal it all seemed. Banner was a Dom but like he said not an asshole, he wanted someone to share his life with in every way and his "kink" was just one of them. Indie had real fears about herself and had always been curious about the Dom/Sub world but never found the right one to trust enough to make her feel safe until she was laid out and plated with poisonous blow fish by Banner.

I feel that this was a sweet book actually, odd to say about a BDSM but it was the first one for me that I didn't feel a shred of Catholic guilt for reading. The relationship between Banner and Indigo was one of mutual respect, pleasure and companionship. I never felt once that Banner was Mr. Alpha Male "I want to control everything little aspect of your life because I am a Dom and you will do as I bid because you are my Sub" instead I got that he wanted to **share** his world with a woman, not control her. From the beginning when he said she was free to speak I realized just how different this book would be. Did he introduce her to a

new lifestyle? Yes. Did he push her limits and what she thought she could handle? Definitely? Did he ever treat her in a way that could/would borderline on abusive? *NEVER!*

I also loved that Indigo was a plus size model (not the perfect slim and slender that we traditionally read) with her rockabilly/pin up style. I thought it added to the story as well the conversation about their background stories; it made them in to people and not some stereotypical characters.

This short novel has a sexy, dominant chef as a hero and a sassy, tattooed fetish model as his submissive heroine. When Banner and Indie meet she's nearly naked and modeling for one of his culinary highlights: lying on a table, dressed with food (among which the deadly blowfish) and having people eating from her body. Indie is a bit unsure about her body, since she's a plus-sized model and her ex-boyfriend always commented on her figure. But Banner is instantly smitten with her and loves her appearance. He also recognizes a natural submissive in Indie and likes to spend some sexy time with her, so he makes her an offer which she can't refuse.

The next three days they spend together as a Dom and sub. Indie is new to all these experiences and Banner knows from the beginning that she's the woman he's been looking for to spend the rest of his life with. She's afraid to admit her feelings although she's having the best time of her life. This causes a little conflict in the end, but everything is resolved very quickly. So this novel is not an angsty one, which doesn't mean it's emotionally underdevelopment. Because since Ms Blake has focused her story mainly on the relationship building, there's plenty of room to explore her characters' emotions and feelings. I must admit that I would've liked to see a bit more of the hero's inner thoughts and feelings, since I felt the focus was more on the heroine than on the hero.

The BDSM scenes can probably considered being on the light side if it were not for the last scene, which takes place in public. The majority of the scenes are about obedience and control, there's a little spanking involved and some anal play, but hardly any bondage and no gags. I thought the sex scenes were scorching and super sexy, which shouldn't be a surprise with such a perfect and hot Dom controlling the scenes. Maybe my only complaint is that Banner felt a bit cliché as a Dom and too perfect, with him knowing exactly what was right for his sub Indie, whom he only just met. So, he seemed a bit too good to be true... And perhaps their whole relationship building went a bit too smoothly, especially given the fact that the story takes place in only three days.

But other than that this was a very enjoyable and sexy story which I couldn't put down and which I finished in nearly one breath. The author's engaging and pleasant writing style contributed to my reading pleasure, something I already experienced earlier with her first novel, *This Side of Heaven*, a paranormal book. No matter if Fallon Blake writes contemporary or paranormal romance, she knows how to hold my interest with her stories.

I LOVED this story. Did you hear that? THE STORY. Yup, this is erotica and there is an actual story in here.

The characters-

Indigo and Banner.

Indigo is a fetish model. She is plus sized, and covered with tattoos. She dresses in the 50's era style clothing and has streaks of color in her normally jet black hair. Indigo wants you to believe that she is okay with how she doesn't fit in with mainstream society. However, the author creatively drops hints in the beginning that Indigo might be more insecure than she is initially admitting.

Banner

Oh Banner, yummiie, yummiie Banner. He's a chef, and a hard-working, no playing, young creative chef. He immediately is attracted to Indigo and everything Indigo represents.

The Story.

Indigo doesn't understand why Banner wants her. He can have anyone and has everything to offer to this "ideal woman". Banner, on the other hand, not only adores Indigo's looks but also her fiery personality. He's

tired of the waif thin, drab, blank canvas type models. In Banner's mind, Indigo is everything the other models are not. While initially just wanting a 3-night stand with Indigo, he quickly realizes that he wants more. To get more from Indigo, Banner knows that he'll have to break down Indigo's walls (her insecurity) and help Indigo discover why she is hiding her true self.

That said, I don't have any experience with bondage, so I have no scale by which to judge the subject matter. The story, however, is great. 4 plus stars. This is too short to earn a coveted (yes, books do so happen to covet my approval) 5 star rating but I will say that this is probably one of the better erotic short stories I've read, considering there wasn't a ton of time to expand on the characters themselves.

These are words I want to see in relation to BDSM :

Trust

Compassion

Partnership

Forget *Safe, Sane and Consensual*. I really would rather the standard be the three words listed above. Submission does not have to equate to a loss of one's person.

Submission is an intriguing concept to me. So much focus in books is often put on the sub and how they need to learn to trust but to me it's also important to find a Dom who is just as much invested in their partner's pleasure as they are in satisfying their own fetishes. To me, the ultimate draw of BDSM is the demonstration of two people coming together to explore what make them tick. It's not about one person having complete control over another, which can often be how Doms (or even alpha males) in books are portrayed.

She happened to like her men a little rough around the edges with a take-charge personality. Tragically, most men seemed to think asshole was included somewhere in that description.

I think a few authors could stand to take that statement to heart. *Wrapped* was about two people exploring a mutual attraction inside of the privacy of the world they made for themselves, not unlike two mainstream people exploring an attraction out in the dating world. There was not an overly intimidating storyline, nor were there crazy plot antics trying to draw us into a stylized version of BDSM. I respected that.

Indie is an aspiring chef who is working as a plus-size model and Banner (I didn't pick the names) is an already established (and somewhat famous) chef who met Indie through a job she took as a nude model used for the purpose of displaying sushi for restaurant patrons to sample. Sparks fly while Banner sets up a display on Indie. When he's finished working he presents her with an interesting offer : stay with him for 3 days and be his submissive.

As she's pondering this over, the customers arrive, an ex-boyfriend causes trouble, and we see that Banner has a protective nature. Of course, this has her intrigued and the story takes off from there.

This little romp was fast, fun, sexy and interesting. I smiled at the scene where Indie gets even with the trouble-making ex. I appreciated the pacing for a short and the ending left me satisfied. All in all, it was a nice little read.
