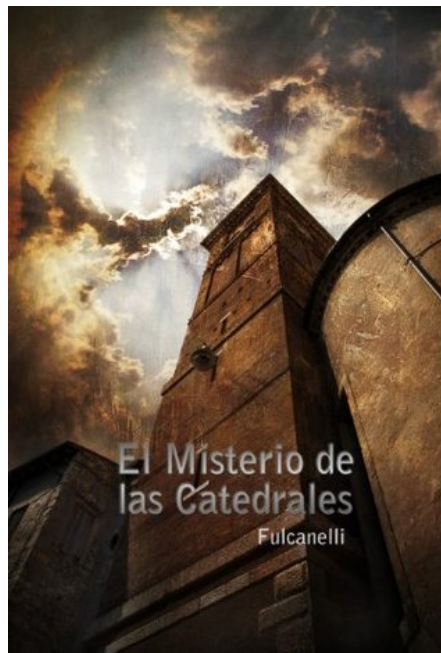

La historia de Fulcanelli se inicia cuando en 1926 el editor parisiense Schemit publicó un libro firmado con el seudónimo de Fulcanelli titulado *El misterio de las catedrales*. Cuatro años después nuevamente el misterioso Fulcanelli publicaba una obra titulada “*Las moradas filosóficas*“. Tras estas publicaciones, cargadas de gran esoterismo y mensaje alquímico y hermético, el autor desapareció. Se considera que Fulcanelli descubrió la piedra filosofal antes de 1930 y que desapareció en 1932. El FBI sigue buscando la pista Fulcanelli, intentando descubrir quién fue realmente, ya que se supone que entre sus posesiones se haya un manuscrito de Roger Bacon que contiene la fórmula de la fisión y la fusión nuclear.

Third, that this is not a book to read, but a book to study, over and over and over again. Thirty years ago it was totally impenetrable to me, now less so. Perhaps in the future it will be even clearer, who knows?

Fourthly, that there are many weak and hazy spots, for instance the so-called phonetic cabala. My suggestion is: study it, with a critical yet open mind.

Lastly, that, here and there, the prose reaches unsurpassed heights. The man or the men behind this works were no ordinary folks.
