I have mixed feelings about this book. I've rated it two stars because the plot was reasonable enough to keep me reading, and because on Goodreads, two stars means 'It was OK.' I thought that the premise was really interesting, and that the world was quite fascinating, but the execution didn't match the promise.

I found this story difficult to read at times. There was a lot of head hopping, and a lot of forwards and backwards in time stuff. Generally, I like head hopping, and don't mind multiple points of view at all, but there just seemed to be so many that they disrupted the flow of the story.

There were also many diversions, disasters, mini-quests and secondary characters, each of whom had their own back story, and sometimes I lost sight of what the main goal was while reading yet another character's subplot or disaster.

The book also needed more proofreading as there were quite a number of errors in the text.

I found this hard to rate as I wasn't sure if it was meant to be Adult or YA. I have decided to rate as YA/Teen as the dialogue and wording are quite simple.
