Though the Chairman feels victorious, Tamaki sees this as betrayal. He wanted all of them to live as family, not excluding his grandmother. Through heartfelt searching and revelation, Tamaki finds a way to touch the heart of his grandmother, connecting with her through her sorrow. However, to connect with his grandmother, he gives up the opportunity to see his mother who has come from France. Though kept on the outside, the host devices a plot to reunite Tamaki and his mother, with the help of the entire school. In the end, his grandmother gives up her grudge, Tamaki makes it to see his mother, and Haruhi confesses her love.
