Talk about unexpected twists and turns! Fred is hit with several shocking surprises in this newest addition to the Cozy Corgi series. None of the charm of the town of Estes Park has changed, with Fred and her close friends plus family, all present and accounted for. This time the murder has Leo asking for Fred's sleuthing skills to clear his fellow Ranger of the murder of a poacher. In her search for information, we get to know a bit more about a few characters recently introduced in the last couple of volumes. Fred discovers there are far more sinister goings-on in the Park than she ever imagined and is confronted with serious danger.

The author has really stepped up the complexity with this story and seems to be building a new and intriguing framework for future mystery-solving for Fred.
