Too quick, it turns out, because Leona Harper was pregnant with his child and was hoping to start a life with Byron. Unable to count on Byron, and thoroughly disgusted with her father, Leona struck out on her own. She's spent the last year having a baby, getting a job at an interior design firm, and helping her sister get out from under her father's control. She never told Byron about the baby for fear he and his family would take little Percy from her.

Now Byron is back in town and his family wants him to open a new restaurant in the Beaumont Brewery building. The building is quite a mess and, of course, will need a complete design makeover. Byron thinks this is a great opportunity to hire Leona for the job and prove that he is over her. Leona definitely needs the job, but this situation has disaster written all over it! Can they work together and not BE together? How can she tell Byron about the baby? Will their families keep them apart?

This story has plenty of angst. The hero and heroine have deep trust issues and can't seem to forgive each other for the mistakes of the past. I liked getting a little more insight into the Beaumont family history with Byron's memories of his childhood. And Leon Harper provides a good shot of venom as the evil villain. Secrets permeate this book, leading to a lot of misunderstandings. I found myself doing a slow burn at the deliberate obtuseness of Byron Beaumont. A man who turns to cooking to soothe his feelings is a different kind of male protagonist and I found myself liking him in the beginning. But his constant needling of his supposed love interest was grating in the extreme.

He kept accusing her of lying, which is the telling of deliberate untruths. But Leona never lied to him, only kept her background hidden. Fool for love that he is, he never really did any digging because he was so besotted with her (or rather let the little head do the thinking for the big head). It seems as if it would have been ridiculously easy for him to connect the dots. After all, her name is only one vowel away from Leon Harper, the nemesis of the Beaumonts. How could he not figure out who she was?!

She also never lied about being pregnant or having Byron's baby. How could she, when she never told him about it in the first place?

Leona is afraid that Byron will turn out to be like his father, an autocratic, dictatorial womanizer and serial husband. Mr. Beaumont, Sr. had the ugly habit of tiring of his wives, divorcing them and keeping the children for himself...a habit shared by Leona's own father. Byron's constant loss of temper doesn't help the situation. Leona claims, quite rightly, that she won't have him around her baby when his moods swing from sullen anger over her perceived untruthfulness to loving daddy. I get her point.

So when she agrees to marry him, I was ready to tear out my hair. Even near the end of the novel, he insists on her telling him the truth. How, exactly, is she or anyone to guarantee complete and constant honesty? Should she take a blood oath? Such a man would be impossible to live with; he would torment a wife constantly.

However, I really prized the moments when Leona is working on decorating and designing Byron's restaurant and when she finally stands up to her own cold-blooded, hostile father. I also liked reading about Byron's cooking and his determined care of his son. Those moments meant a lot more to me than the sex or furious arguments. Kinda depressing, when you think about it.

Byron Beaumont has returned to Denver after living in various parts of France and Spain for more than a year. His brother's want him to open a restaurant to go along with the new brewery they have opened. He's hesitant, but decides to do it. He can't help remembering plans that he and his former girlfriend Leona Harper had dreamed of about her designing the restaurant he wanted to open one day, so he tracks down the firm she's working for and arranges for her to work with him from the ground floor of designing this restaurant.

Leona Harper can't help having her breath taken away when she sees the man she loves again, but she's also terrified he'll learn her secret before she's had a chance to tell him. They have an almost 6 month old son that he knows nothing about.

Bitter family feuding led Leona to not tell him who her father was when they were dating. When her father

came in and destroyed his family's business and led him to believe Leona had been in on it over a year ago, he believed she had been deceiving him and conspiring with her father, so he left town without bothering to hear her side of the story. Good book. Byron was always a little out of step with the rest of his family. He didn't want anything to do with the brewery business, he wanted to be a chef. He finally got his wish and was working at a Denver restaurant when he met Leona. They hit it off immediately, and spent a lot of time sharing their dreams for the future. Then Byron discovered that Leona was the daughter of his family's worse enemy and felt betrayed. Rather than sticking around, he left to work in Europe and has been gone for a year. His brothers called him back and asked him to build restaurant to go with the brewery, one that he will have full control of. He has decided to hire Leona to design it - as a way to show her that he is over her, and to get answers about why she did it.

Leona had been in love with Byron and disgusted with her father. She was trying to get away from him, which is why she was working in the restaurant. Her father's actions the day she discovered she was pregnant were the last straw. But before she was even able to tell Byron about the baby, he was gone, with no contact. She knows she should have told him about the baby, but she was afraid of the Beaumont reputation with children, so she didn't. Now that he is back, she knows she has to tell him.

Though Byron is angry about it, he doesn't immediately threaten to take the baby away. I liked the way that he was determined to protect Leona and Percy. When he finds out the threats that her father has made against her, Byron decides that marriage is the best way to stop him. All he has to do is convince Leona.

I loved seeing the relationship rekindle between them. Even though they had been apart a year, the chemistry was still strong. They also still had their dreams in common. I loved seeing how the plans for the restaurant went so smoothly. The problem that they had was one of being able to trust each other again. Byron couldn't be certain that Leona wasn't going to side with her father, and that made him hold part of himself back from her. Leona was constantly afraid that Byron would abandon her again, and this time take Percy with him. It took another run in with her father for them to actually talk to each other and share their fears. Once they had done that, they could finally look to the future.

I did feel that their confrontation with her father was left slightly unresolved. They have their intentions to stand against him, but I'd have liked to see how they do it. There's another book in the series, so maybe there will be a bit more included there.
