This book is the second in the series but you could read it without having read book one. We find Lady Amanda just as bossy as in the previous book. Her relationship with poor old Hugo is developing and her relationship with the police inspector has not improved. Andrea Frazer sets the scene prior to the murder very carefully and manages to introduce a lot of exaggerated aristocratic characters with the same light touch as in the previous book so that you either like them or can't stand them. You have your suspicions about each of them by the time the murder takes place. It is a version of the country house murder mystery once again in the best Christie tradition. I found the rant made by one of the characters towards the end rather moving and there was some warmth and understanding starting to develop between the main characters that appealed to

Ignoring the rather weak plot and even weaker characterisation - I had no idea that Lady Amanda's supposed to be fairly elderly until three-quarters of the way through - any book that relies on the pronunciation (or mispronunciation) of people's curiously spelled surnames is always going to struggle. We are told, for example, that the butler's name - Beauchamp - is pronounced as Beecham by everyone except his employer. Fair enough except, of course, it's spelled exactly the same way regardless of who's saying it - perhaps it works better in the audio book version..? All in all, a serious disappointment.
