Okay, that last one was pretty cool. Despite being more of a romance there are a few unique aspects that any alien smut lover will enjoy!!!

After a brief, bitchy five-minute conversation, Dex deduces that Zoey, despite being a petty Earthling, is his one true mate. Awe. So he snatches her up and lugs her into his cool spaceship, which we don't know much about because although she's allegedly got a degree in alien culture, she asks a grand total of one (1) question. Seriously, for someone who spent her entire education focused on aliens, she seems to hate them (and that's before they, well, kidnap her). And don't give me that look — that *“but she's been kidnapped, of course she's too traumatized to look around and be curious”* look — because she's certainly not afraid enough to mouth off to anyone who looks at her.

You can probably surmise that I'm not Zoey's biggest fan. I think she was unnecessarily rude and suspiciously unfazed by alien technology. And ignorant, for that matter, despite her degree. Yes, the

Zerconians are a private species, but she did know that they were sexist and tall — she was still flabbergasted by both of these things. Sure, it sucks, but *you already knew that, Zoey*.

World building was also petty. Yes, I'm still nursing a grudge over the fact that she asked one fucking question about a floating mattress. She didn't ask Dex to clarify Zerconian terms like "minder" until wayyy later in the book, when I stopped giving a shit.

She's also one of those sassy for the sake of being different and cool and unique heroines. But Zoey, ever the wannabe badass, insists, **"I need to get to the bridge.' She needed more information."**

Really? That's so weird because YOU DON'T EVEN WANNA BE THERE AND YOU DON'T LIKE DEX OR THOR OR ANY ONE OF THOSE GIANT IDIOTS. What the hell are you gonna do anyway? Of course she ends up semi-"helping," but it's so unrealistic how she just assumes their ship was hijacked. Why would Dex, or anyone, listen to her? Her only evidence is literally that they're usually friendly. How do you automatically jump to, "oh jeez, they must've been jumped?" without more information or context? And look at how she describes a movie to an alien race who has no idea what she's on about: **"A motion picture? Actors? Scripts, action, comedy, romance?"**

The only thing she got right was a motion picture, but instead of expanding on it, she just throws random terms around. Describing the components of something is not defining it, Zoey. For example, I wouldn't define a house like this: walls! kitchen, door, condo, bungalow! She continually has no regard for the fact that they do not understand what the hell she's talking about half the time and makes no efforts to explain her colloquialisms or idioms. If I was Dex, I would leave her right where I found her and never look back.

But guess what? I wouldn't wanna be Dex either, 'cause he sucks. Listen to this half-assed nonsense: **"Well? What do you think?" he asked as he took hold of his cock, running his hand up and down the thick shaft."**
