The premise of this book is enjoyable (exploring how an intense psychological experiment can have lasting effects on a person). However, my main issue with this book is pacing. There are quite a few characters introduced throughout this book (though many of them are only present for a couple of pages), and it seems to jump around a lot. This might, however, have to do with the formatting of the eBook. Paragraphs are not always marked by an indentation, and there are no spaces between them, making it easy to lose track of who you are supposed to be focusing on. Another issue that I had (which may again be the result of the eBook formatting) is that much of the dialogue is not ended with periods, but with hyphens, indicating that the person speaking is being cut off. However, this is only rarely the case. For a person who reads "aloud" in their head, this can really mess with the way that the book is read. Aside from these issues, it was a good read.

Brainwashed: A Thriller has an intriguing premise, one inspired by real-life experiments that took place decades earlier. It truly is frightening to realize that one has no control when certain triggers occur through

something as simple as a phone call.

Zeb's character is well drawn, but the others not so much. The pacing was going along fine but during the past 50+ pages or so, events began to feel really rushed. It killed the suspense and made me question to the logic of ending a complex situation with relative ease. One of the villains appears to have gotten away with his crimes, which also made for an unsatisfying ending. The author is a bestselling contemporary novelist who also writes romances. Perhaps that's why the thriller component was the weakest part of the book.
