According to the tabloids, he's not much different from her ex, so why should she give him a chance, even though there is obvious chemistry between them? That flight--phew--let's just talk about some swoony sparks flying right along with that plane. Cole has changed. He's learned from his past and is moving on towards a better future, one that he wants to have Jillian be a part of. Trust issues cause a lot of problems for these two and only time will tell if they can both move on.

Jillian obviously has issues and for good reason, but I still really like her. I could feel her hesitation and I felt myself wearing down by Cole's constant wooing. A few small annoyances (Jillian's over-obsessed fears) but overall a very sweet and enjoyable quick-read.

3.5-ish stars. *Cole and Jillian* is the third of the contemporary romance novellas that I picked up as a Kindle freebie package. I enjoyed how all three stories have a connection to music, but in very different ways. This one has a country western star as the hero, so if you like the celebrity romances, it'll be up your alley.

Cole and Jillian meet when they're seated next to each other on a plane. Jillian is heading back from Las Vegas, where she got a divorce from her two-timing musician husband, so she's not all that impressed or interested when she's seated next to a handsome musician. Been there, done that. But Jillian is also terrified of planes, and she and Cole end up chatting and then making out for half the plane ride. Hey, he was just trying to distract her from her fears! (And actually she made the first move.)

But they go their separate ways once they get home to Nashville. Jillian has a career and a quiet life that suits her, and famous musicians, especially ones with substance abuse problems, and the high life are not anything she wants, at all. But Cole shows up again, months later, after he's been clean all this time, and now wants to give a relationship with Jillian a shot. He's an incredibly nice guy, and Jillian has a hard time saying no to him, despite all her fears.

Cole's such a good guy that it's a little hard to see why she won't give him a shot, despite the rough bumps in his past. This one is really all about Jillian coming to terms with her hesitations and concerns. To some extent I get it, particularly since she's been burned before. But she does do a lot of dithering, which got a bit old after a while. There's also a needless misunderstanding that's a little too similar to the one that happened in the previous book, not to mention I'm way over romantic misunderstandings as a plot device.

There are several characters from the earlier two stories in this series who play a fairly important role in this story, so you'll definitely enjoy this more if you're familiar with the secondary characters here, but it's readable as a stand-alone novel.

Jillian Jones was married to Danny for twelve years. But when the winner of Nashville Has Talent, let fame go to his head and he started using drugs and cheating on her, Jillian divorced him. She loves her job as a physical therapist for an orthopedic group, going to her own home everyday after work and working in her yard on the weekends. She doesn't want to get involved with another country music star, but she can't get Cole Pendleton, who she kissed on a flight from Las Vegas to Nashville, out of her mind. Can the swoony, country singer, who's wrestled some of the same demons as Jillian's ex-husband, prove that he's a changed man?

This wasn't as lighthearted as *Pianos and Promises #2*, but not as serious as the first one. It's a story about proving just because you may have a similar history as someone, that doesn't make you the same. Cole took his life back from the drinking and drugs and wanted to prove to Jillian that she could trust him.

I feel very lucky to have snagged an ARC of Cole and Jillian. I had just read the excerpt at the end of Beck and Call, and was hooked after reading the prologue.

Jillian Jones has just finalized her divorce from her musician husband, Danny Hilton. She has a bit of a phobia about flying and is pretty worked up on the airplane. The man next to her is sweet, and funny, and takes her mind off her fears, but he happens to be country music legend, Cole Pendleton. As much as Jillian likes him, she is determined not to go down that road again. Cole gives them both time to recover from recent life changes, then he sets out to win Jillian's trust, and show her that not all musicians are the same.

As I have come to expect from Jennifer Peel, the characters were easy to relate to. Jillian was so vulnerable after her experiences with her ex-husband. I just wanted to sit with her, share some ice cream, and urge her to give Cole a chance. I was rooting for Cole as he taught her that she could trust again. I loved the way he broke down her defenses, and his gentleness and patience.

I also loved the setting in Nashville. I felt like I was there, and loved the glimpse into the music industry. It would be so surreal to see Keith Urban at the grocery store. I only hope that I could be the type of person to give a star their privacy, and not gawk at them. The story really came alive for me.

You don't have to read Beck and Call first, but the main characters are best friends, so there is some overlap.

If you're looking for a sweet romance with a cocky, charming, and funny cowboy, look no further. You'll laugh, you'll smile, and you will have the urge to listen to country music. I highly recommend it!

This is part of a series and the others intrude more than in previous works. Call, in particular (from Beck and Call), is prominent. So yeah, read the others first. That said, this one lives up to the quality of the others and that's a good thing.

There's a touch of instalove in this one, but I think Peel pulls it off. She does that by adding two factors that make it feel real. The first is by conveying that sense of instant connection you get with people sometimes. That this is the start of a romantic relationship makes sense but it's hard to show that happening and Peel does a good job. Seeing their initial meeting and connection ensured I bought their start and was along to see it develop. But enhancing that is having Cole and Jillian act sensibly around that first connection. Cole leaving her alone for ten months afterwards wouldn't have worked if his reasons weren't so outstanding (he wanted to make sure his rehab was enduring and that she had time to get over her recent rocky breakup). So even though you got the sense of the strength of his attraction, staying away for a time had me buying him as someone wanting to make the best possible shot at a relationship that could last.

Even better, Peel expressed Jillian's essentially negative motivation (not wanting to be hurt—i.e. status quo) in positive terms. So instead of "I don't want to be hurt" she's "doing the things that bring me peace and make me happy". You can see how a romantic partner has an easier time working into the second. Yes, she's still scared due to the blow-up of her previous marriage to someone semi-famous. But she's adult enough to recognize that fear and try to overcome it by reframing it in positive terms. I liked that.

Cole was a bit too perfect and a setback before final resolution was rather predictable to give this a full five stars. It earned all four, though, so I'm happy to leave it there.

A note about missing faith: This was subtle as they spend most of the story getting to the I Love Yous. Still, Peel stretched "let's take things slow" a bit far for two people who weren't particularly religious and didn't seem like they'd object to the sexy times. So the chastity was a noticeable construct by the end, though I don't think it felt overtly manipulated; it was more a niggling that they should have progressed past kissing by now.
