Growing up, he is forced to live in a manure shack, dodge other children's insults, and survive their bullying. This should change when he turns sixteen and tries to become an Elekai' Warrior. However, the tryouts go terribly wrong. And he is to be executed. That is when a Renegade Warrior steps forward to claim him.

Gisbo finds he is Renegade born and whisked away to a different kind of warrior training. He soars on a flying sword, raises a boon animal, and best of all, makes friends. However, there are still challenges to overcome. Finding his boon nearly costs him his life. Among all his new friends, there are still bullies. An evil lurks, trying to destroy the Renegades, and Gisbo still has to pass his math test.

First off, I thoroughly enjoyed this book and the rest of the series.

This is a young adult fantasy series, but will appeal to all adults that in there hearts have truly never grown up. I say "never grown up" because this book and subsequent series appeal to that part of us that are mostly teenage boys/ girls. This is a great fantasy series, that strays from the well trodden path. These stories contain a great deal of action, but what truly appealed to me was the generous amount of humor mixed in to the story. I am the first to admit that the humor is a tad bit low brow, but that only makes the experience more fun and maybe a guilty pleasure. This is a series that I can constantly reread or in my case re-listen (as i prefer audiobooks) simply because like many good books it has the ability to change my mood and more importantly, make me laugh. I realize that some people will call this book nothing but sexist toilet humor, but discounting this book for those reasons is a mistake. The story can stand on its own and at points it does. The authors magic system is unique and his world is increasingly fleshed out as the series progress, it is not simply an "an overgrown manga inspired comic". The characters are unique and plentiful especially in this first installment, but as the series grows so do the characters, as they continually evolve and even at its low points they seem to always evoke the proper emotions.
