All Lara wanted to do was break things off with her boyfriend Phillip and move on. Unfortunately, while attempting to impress her with his magical skills, Phillip manages to turn himself into a wolf. Lara feels kinda guilty about the whole scenario. I wouldn't! She and her ceremonial magician friend Roxie have tried just about everything they can think of attempting to reverse Phillip's ill-conceived spell. About all they accomplish is burning a hole in the carpet. Whoops. Lara's talents are good for making plants grow, not transmutation! And Roxie, well, studying up on the rituals and processes needed to make her magic work properly never was high on her list of priorities. Hence the hole in the carpet.

The girls realize that they need help, or Phillip's going to be stuck using the doggie-door for the rest of his four-legged life. Who better than the werewolves to help them figure out how to turn a wolf back into a man! There's a lot of tension between the two races, but what's a girl to do?

When Roxie introduces Lara to the alpha of the local werewolf pack, things begin to get interesting. It turns out that someone with magical abilities is murdering weres, and he strikes a bargain with Lara: sniff out the killer using her innate ability to sense magic and trace it to its owner, and he'll help her solve Phillip's problem. If she can just shake the FBI agent who seems to be convinced she had something to do with her ex's disappearance, she may be able to straighten out the disaster her life is quickly becoming.

I tried to think of how to sum up my feelings on this series, and it was a little difficult. The only thing I can compare this to is going to a drive-thru and ordering a meal. The story actually goes into mystery mode as she reaches out for help from the Alpha of the local werewolves and in exchange for his help, she needs to help solve some recent murders. An interesting world is being unveiled with different ethnicities of magical beings.

Okay, when first starting the book I can't say that I was blown away. But once entering the mystery part of it, things got a lot more interesting and I want to see what happens next. The overall story is broken up into parts. These are short with both Parts 1 and 2 each being under 100 pages. I know Part 3 is expected to be released soon, but I have no idea how many parts make up the entire story.
