Falling for the Bad Girl is the first of a new series, 'Cutting Loose', by Nina Croft. As the title indicates, the story follows 'bad girl' Regan Malloy after her release from Holloway prison and her arresting officer (all puns intended) Detective Sergeant Nathan 'Nate' Carter. The setting of the story is contemporary London, in a 'real world' scenario.

If you've read Nina Croft's works before, you know they are hot enough to fog your e-reader, and this is no exception. But, it's more than just a sizzling romantic escapade. Nina weaves a story rich in characters and with all the complexities that life likes to throw at all of us, and uses humour and drama to good effect that keeps you involved in the characters journeys. Scenes are set and painted in clear detail, bringing the reader into the story with little effort. All the characters, and I do mean all of them, come through as authentic.

I enjoyed the polar extremes of family that Nina explores in this story, and the pressure placed on Regan and Nate by them. Regan's family are career criminals, while Nate comes from law enforcement. The story is driven by the themes of temptation, choices and consequence that will keep you turning the pages to find out how Regan and Nate deal with their fates.

This story is, in my opinion, best suited for mature readers who are fans of very steamy romantic drama.

I love a story about a bad boy getting with the good girl so when I read the blurb for *Falling for the Bad Girl* I really liked the idea of that role reversal. Shout out to Nina Croft for writing some pretty hot instant attraction and characters that aren't perfect, which is what really stood out for me.

You can't get more opposite than a cop and an ex-con. Meet Nathan and Regan. Nathan first laid eyes on Regan when he was working a case that ended with her arrested and then behind bars for three years. Three years that left him obsessed with a girl that was nothing but bad news and zero chance of anything happening between them.

Regan gave up three years of her life for a mistake, a mistake done for all the right reasons but still against the law. She is determined to leave that in the past and forge a new start. She doesn't plan to ever cross paths with the man she should hate but secretly can't stop thinking about. But there wouldn't be a story if things worked out quiet like they expected and on her first day out, Regan and Nate find themselves giving in to their lust for each other.

This starts off as a pretty standard friends with benefits type deal. Regan knows that she can never have something real with Nate. Her family has an extensive criminal history and she feels that her past would always hang over her head. Nate knows that they are just too different. Different personalities and different upbringings have them at polar opposites. Where he sees black and white, she sees shades of gray. Thinking that they are too different but still drawn to each other like moths to a flame, they agree to hook up but keep their lives completely separate.

It was interesting to see these two go from being strictly in a sexual relationship to opening up to each other on a deeper level. Regan sharing her dream of going independent and having her own business and Nathan sharing his grief over his father, it all added layers to their relationship that they didn't plan on. I especially loved the scenes with Regan's family. They were so foreign to Nate but he was able to appreciate their love for each other and it helped soften him. For his love of Regan, Nate was able to change his views – he became more flexible and less rigid.

I enjoyed this one, it was a quick easy read, very low on drama and has some angst but was a sweet HEA. I did feel that their FB relationship started super fast. And their first physical encounter read a little too cold and calculated that it throw me off for a bit. It felt very wham-bam-thank-you-ma'am and that's not really my style. Don't get me wrong it was hot and kind of kinky (in a good way!) but I didn't feel that instant emotional connection from either one of the MCs until later on in their story. I don't think this will bother most because Nate and Regan both go in with their eyes wide open. They both literally just want to get off and enjoy their physical relationship. But for me personally, I needed that something extra, a hint that this wasn't just sex for the sex. Like I said, they agree to have this sex only relationship and eventually they do start to develop deeper feelings for each other but it's definitely a slow burn getting to the emotional side of their relationship.

Two things drew me to this book: the premise of the story - a hot cop falls for a thief - which I *loved*, and the setting of the story - London.

However, I didn't enjoy it as much as I'd expected.

I found some of the details a bit unbelievable and I felt disconnected from the characters.

The execution was a bit lacking, which I suspect it's due to the shortness of the novel. The story lacks more excitement and the thrill of the forbidden. It also lacks a meaningful depth.

I would have loved it if we had been given a chance to read about the events prior to the heroine's incarceration.

As for the setting, the story is set in London but the atmosphere just didn't feel authentic to me.

Anyhow, this book is perfect if you're looking for a quick, entertaining read. I, on the other hand, always prefer deeper, more elaborate relationships and storylines.

REVIEW: FALLING FOR THE BAD GIRL is the first installment in Nina Croft's contemporary, adult CUTTING LOOSE erotic, romance series. This is detective Nathan Carter, and former inmate Regan Malloy's story line.

Told from dual third person perspectives (Nathan and Regan) FALLING FOR THE BAD GIRL follows former inmate Regan Malloy—a second generation thief—who upon her release from prison finds herself in bed with the very man who made the arrest and sent her away. Enter detective Nathan Carter—a second generation police officer—and the man who hasn't stopped thinking about the beautiful woman who stars in all of his erotic fantasies and dreams. What ensues is the building but forbidden relationship between thief and detective—Regan and Nathan—and Regan's attempts to hide their secret from the family she loves.

FALLING FOR THE BAD GIRL finds Nathan Carter unable to separate business from pleasure. His attraction to Regan comes at a time when his personal life begins to implode as the father he adores battles cancer, and a relationship with a former thief threatens his advancement and standings on the force. Regan is determined to go straight but her relationship with detective Nathan Carter is all sorts of problems for her family and her friends. As our heroine struggles with her future, Nathan struggles with his relationship with the woman with whom he is falling in love. The sex scenes are seductive and intense.

We are introduced to all of Regan's family members including her brother Tom, father Sam and mother Sarah Malloy, as well as Nathan's father, former detective Pete Carter. Regan's friendships on the inside are her only hope upon release—former inmates Darcy and Summer who help our heroine get settled and start her on a path towards a new life.

FALLING FOR THE BAD GIRL switches up the bad boy/good girl trope in that our heroine is guilty of the crimes she committed— a reformed thief, an ex-con, who is determined to make it on her own in a world that does not accept the life that she once led. The premise is entertaining; the characters are spirited, intelligent and dynamic; the romance is provocative and challenging. FALLING FOR THE BAD GIRL is a spicy look at a forbidden relationship.

Falling for the Bad Girl is an opposites-attract love story. Regan comes from a family of thieves, Nathan is not only a second generation police detective, but he is the one who put Regan behind bars. By rights they shouldn't feel any attraction, though three years of fantasizing over each other shows how chemistry doesn't always work as one wants.

Our story starts the day Regan comes out of prison a new woman set on never, ever having to step into that place again. While she gets on with her plans, Nathan is not in a great place. His father is gravely ill and he doesn't have much time left, and he's obsessed with a now ex-con... the fact that he follows her to the hotel where she's spending her first night as a free woman should be a wake-up call for him... Luckily for us, it isn't.

Regan can't believe her eyes when the man she's been crushing on despite her best efforts shows up at her hotel. She should hate his guts, and she does as he is the one who put her behind bars, but one night to live the dream can't harm anyone, can it?

What begins as a night for Nathan and Regan to get their fantasies out of their systems, turns into a month of hot, steamy, crazy-monkey sex. When that month is over, they will each go their own ways, as a relationship between them has no chance in hell of ever succeeding, right?

I really liked Regan, while she was perceived as a bad girl, once we get to know her we realize not everything is as it seems. She was loyal, sweet, caring and still tough. Loved this book!! A contemporary romance that shows some risks are worth taking.

As the blurb states, Detective Nate Carter put Regan Malloy away for a diamond theft. The merchandise has never been recovered. During the trial, Regan and Nate felt an attraction that went beyond ordinary. After Regan serves three years in prison, Nate and she hook up. After one night of unbridled sex, they know it can't be just the one time, so they embark on an adventure of no strings sex for one month. Both think that should be enough to drive the other from their system. But as the month progresses, uneasiness creeps in and neither wants to think of the end approaching!

Believing any type of relationship just would not work, neither know how to contain their feelings. Nate is a detective and Regan comes from a family of known thieves. That's a recipe for disaster. Even since Regan has gone clean and has opened her own business of cracking safes and software-but for the good guys, she still feels putting the cops anywhere close to her family spells trouble with a capital T! But she also knows that what is developing with Nate is quickly becoming something she doesn't want to give up. She just can't. But how can they make it work?? Nate feels the same way. He knows he's breaking all kinds of rules and his work partner has cautioned him. He wants him to be smart. But he can't see letting Regan go any more than she can him.

This story was a good mix of steam and sweet. I liked both Regan and Nate. Their situation is a complex one

not unlike real life. I think that's why it was easy to read and to recognize their struggles. Regan, though she comes from a family well known for their propensity to commit crimes, had separated herself from that aspect, until she was tricked into a job, believing she was doing it to save a friend's life. In the end, she was left diamondless, realizing she was manipulated, and found guilty. As she walks out of the prison, she sees Nate and knows the attraction she felt for him since the beginning is still there, and now has confirmation they look they shared as she was sentenced means it's reciprocated.

Regan's friends and former cellmates, Darcy and Summer, pick her up and treat her to a celebration, which includes, among other presents, her staying in the hotel room for the night. After her friends leave, Regan isn't sure what to do next...until she sees Nate outside the building.

Nate finds himself outside, vowing not to go to Regan, yet unable to resist. The two meet at the bar and a flirtation ensues which quickly leads to them realizing they want to act on their chemistry, and agree it'll be just one night away from reality. When they find themselves at the same location the next night, both hoping the other is there, they decide to explore their craving for each other, keeping this part separate from everything else, and give it an end date of one month.

Immediately, I was intrigued by the characters of Regan Malloy and Detective Sergeant Nathan Carter. These two have a history going back three years, to when Nate arrested Regan and helped to send her to prison. For some inexplicable reason, these two are drawn to each other.
