ENG: Darth Maul was one of my favorites from the prequel trilogy and so I was very happy that there will be a little comic series with him. In the first two parts (which appear here in Germany in a magazine) we read about Maul's hatred and passion. He particularly hates the Jedi and is eager to finally show it and reveal himself. But his master, Darth Sidious of course holds him back because he sees his plans in danger otherwise. Reluctantly, Maul sticks to it and lets his anger out elsewhere. Through an opponent, he learns of a captured Jedi Padawan, which is to be auctioned. With the help of Aurra Sing and Cad Bane, he makes his

way to her. I like the drawing style very well and the dialogue is well written. Pretty much the same thing I imagined. Even Aurra and Cad are not Out of Character. I think it's great that the two are there. I really liked the two in The Clone Wars. Directed by Cullen Bunn, this is a very good comic. In this issue, we find out why Maul cares so much about revenge. In a flashback, Sidious takes him to Malachor (from the KOTOR games and seen in Rebels). There, he feels the cuts and burns of the Sith who were killed by Jedi. So it gives good insight into his character. Also interesting to see him work alongside a couple of familiar bounty hunters.

Among the Sith Lords that I have seen or read (Vader, Sidious, Zannah and Revan) Maul is portrayed to be the most athletic, yet the most brash as well. His craving to kill some Jedi takes him to the far reaches of the galaxy with an unusual band of bounty hunters.

While the hunt is the main plot of the story, this issue also brings us to when the Jedi annihilated the Sith Shrine, and things get interesting there as the Knights are portrayed to be the baddies as the Siths, only longing to be free are killed.

Darth Maul #2 is a worthy addition to Marvel's line of Star Wars comics. I just hope that there are other Sith Lord stories they'd tell.
