Hailey is quite young, only 18 and is naive relative to relationships. Of course AJ stands her up but after an apology and her forgiveness (which I don't understand) she agrees to meet him at his apartment, where **NONE OF IT MAKES SENSE**. The apartment is dark and he keeps like that while he decides he's going to sleep with her first and turn the lights on later. And not once does she protest, or try to figure out who he is???
