In Batman Sword of Azrael (1992) #1-4, a major new hero was introduced to the Batman mythos. Now, another character is added to the Batman family. Only this time, it's a villain. As a result of these tests, Bane has spent a lifetime as the toughest inmate in the worst prison on the South American island of Santa Prisca where he acquired his berserk strength, a savage, calculating intellect, and an unparalleled megalomania. He ultimately sets his sights on Gotham City, and goes gunning for the Dark Knight.

Vengeance of Bane is a stand alone Batman story that contains Bane's first appearance and origin. This is a personal favorite of mine and nicely builds Bane as a layered character and a serious threat. Bane would go on to be pivotal in the Knightfall epic. In a sense this is a prelude to that story, and you will be missing the majority of Bane's interactions and effects on Batman if you don't continue on to those collections. This is however a complete story in itself and a fantastic read.

It is difficult to postulate a culture in which an infant is placed in prison and a child is treated like an adult and punished for their father's sins (think original guilt on steroids, or maybe Venom?) Vengeance of Bane (VB) presents the reader with such a world and Dixon actually accomplishes to make this scenario plausible, of pulling and stretching the narrative to create an interesting background for Bane. While far from high art VB is a fun read and worth the 68 pages it is printed on. I liked it, 3 stars.

Read this along with the "Knightfall" series due to the inclusion of Bane in "The Dark Knight Rises." It was a pretty good origin story, giving the character weight and significance beyond his cartoonishly imposing physical presence (and also giving readers of "Knightfall" a much-needed chance to actually care about Bane's henchmen). The vendetta against Batman without ever meeting him is, I suppose, a little odd, but this is a world we're talking about where it's normal for people to have archenemies; Bane in this case fits the logic. So yes, he is a character contrived for the sole purpose of defeating Batman (and selling a lot of comics in the process), but at least he's a successful contrivance, and certainly among the best additions to the character's latter-day rogues' gallery.
