The review at Panels was accurate. These three first issues of DC Comics : Bombshells are fun, well written and beautifully drawn. Issue 2 introduces Wonder Woman and her Amazon sisters. You are reading from the point of view of a pilot Steve Trevor who is involved in a air battle above the Amazon's island. These Amazons are not your usual ones. Well, they are close to their mythological counterparts. These are warriors not saviors.

Wonder Woman's section is *much* better in this second issue. It's less about Diana's interest in Steve Trevor and more about her determination to go against her loved ones in order to do what's right. There's a touching moment between her and a couple Amazons. Her interactions with Mera are fun too.

The Supergirl and Stargirl section is also better. Faster paced and higher emotional stakes. I'm genuinely curious as to how they'll turn out.

Zatanna's part is also pretty interesting, with an unexpected appearance by a character I've been growing fond of lately.

Overall, an improvement from the first issue, which I found more awkward than anything. If you were thinking of dropping the series, give it another try with this issue. It might change your mind.
