It will be hard for you to read this, hard for you to accept but that's what it is...Grey does not change!!!!

This is not a book for feminists!

This is absolutely the most real werewolf book I have ever read. It's so unique, so different; like nothing I have ever read before. The wolves always retain their true nature, neither thinking nor acting as the true humans in the world do, embracing a dog-like pack mentality, indicating that they are actually more wolf than human. Main characters are in constant competition for higher rank in the hierarchy, and only the aggressive actions of the alpha male held the female in check.

First, a warning: if you are a feminist, don't read Grey's Tribute. The characters and the plot will make you so angry you will want to punch your screen (I am deadly serious).

Now, let's begin the review.

First, I want to begin by the characters:

Honestly, I couldn't feel an ounce of sympathy towards Meela, no matter how much what happened to her was unfair. I found her weak, insecure, stubborn, and the way that she couldn't resist the mate bond, no matter how awful Grey acted towards her, made me mad beyond belief. If a man ever dares treat me like him, I will kick him where the sun doesn't shine, mate bond or not. Plus, she's too easily influenced or manipulated by the others. She may be strong in her own way, but mentally she is too easily breakable, and each time she can just be free, she doesn't take her chance and falls in either Victoria's or Grey's traps.

Then, Grey: In all the books I've read, never in my whole life, never, have I wanted to be in a story so much just for the pleasure of slapping the disgusting male lead. I don't understand him. I don't at all. How can a mate be so cruel and so prideful? Does he even love Meela at all? I found myself clutching my covers while reading this story, because Grey is the most horrible male character I've ever read about. His hypocrisy also surprises me: saying to Meela "I am sorry, I don't want to do this, I don't want to hurt you", and then hurting her to the point she almost dies out of her injuries, then no, just no. Also, getting angry if she just speaks to a male when he has had an affair with his twin brother's mate is unacceptable.

Then, after everything he's done to her, he's still bad enough to manipulate her into coming back with him. To me, it felt like he had no regrets at all, because when you hurt the person that you love so much, even if you love them to the point of dying, I do not believe you can act like this and then be vicious enough to get them back no matter what. If this is love, then I want to stay single all my life and grow old with my dog lol.

Grey and Meela weren't the only characters with whom I've had problems. Practically all the characters in this story: the weak and cowardly brother that couldn't even fight for his sister, Victoria, Grey and Fin's Mum that just watches and doesn't really act to save poor Meela when she feels sad for her, that damn Stephanie,

Alpha Steve, and so more.

For me, the characters in Grey's Tribute are awful. They act like hypocrites, are extremely cruel. They're unrealistic, because I do believe that some people wouldn't have acted the way they did, some of them would have intervened to help Meela.

I am sorry I seem harsh. I found myself extremely frustrated while reading this book, to the point of biting my nails.

But well, enough with the characters.

The plot: too much illogical and unrealistic, and it's cliché for a werewolf story. Some events don't make sense, and there were times I found myself confused because one moment Meela was in a place and then the next she was elsewhere. Same for the time.

Again, some characters' reactions are just... impossible. I was confused at how Alpha Steve became Meela's enemy in less than some minutes whereas they seemed to have gotten along since she was small. The story is also very cliché, maybe the names of the packs and some other things make it less cliché than other werewolf stories, but it's still a cliché.

The chapters are very repetitive, and honestly, the story is very boring. I couldn't finish it and there were some chapters I skipped. The writing isn't addictive nor entrancing. I think that the author has a very good vocabulary though, and I loved a lot of her figures of speech, but the way all of it coordinates is bad and isn't well structured, especially because of the lack of logic in the plot. The grammar is also bad, and the speeches aren't well written. They do not suit some of the characters like Grey, and do not support the story. It also lacks description concerning the places. I do believe that if it is edited it will be much better.

Sorry, this story is just not one I would read. This simply shows male domination and violence, and not love. It is not a relationship of love, not the way it's portrayed and narrated. I also had a problem with the narration, the story is not well said and again, the events can make you really confused and the characters are infuriating and lack depth.

This is one of the most realistic and gripping werewolf stories you can read. The characters are highly complex and they exist in a world that values strength over compassion, only the strong survive. The life inside the pack mimics that of a real wolf pack with a strict hierarchy that is established through fighting and power. It is also comparable to a medieval court, the king holds his divine right to rule and the queen exists solely to please and support the king. Throw in scheming courtiers with the ability to change into wolves with sharp claws and fangs and you have the pack construct.

As the characters are basically wolves housed in a human skin and the story is laced with animalistic references and traits displayed by all. We first meet the main characters Meela and Grey it is on a bloody battlefield where they recognise each other as their soul mate, and Grey takes Meela as tribute for his pack's help in her brother's fight. From this point on Meela belongs to Grey, and in this world a highly spirited female with a propensity for impulsive actions matched to a dog stubborn, self assured, dominant male is going to cause problems.

We follow Meela in her journey to become the pack's Luna, a pack who are even more wolf than the one she comes from, and with a mate who has set the highest standards for her to reach as his Luna(female Alpha) and will accept nothing less than perfection. In the midst of all this and the struggle they face to form a personal and public relationship there is one incident that will change them both and the fate of the pack completely. From that point on both Meela and Grey are inevitably changed and for them to be together, either one or both need to change, but when you live in a world where you are taught that weakness is easily exploited and to admit defeat can potentially lead to your destruction.

If you are looking for a werewolf story where there is a soft fluffy romance, where the male character acts all tough but is nothing more than a marshmallow around his soulmate then I suggest you look elsewhere... or brave out the aggression and violence of their world and get to know these nuanced and flawed characters who will draw you into a dark world and see where they lead you.
