Set in prehistoric times, with an overtly stereotypical caveman family named "The Grunts" as the main characters, Tomie dePaola once again creates an amusing story about a dinosaur egg that hatches unexpectedly, introducing a new cumbersome pet for "Little Grunt", the youngest Grunt child.

The baby dinosaur, named "George" by Little Grunt, turns out to be by nature a difficult houseguest, eating the Grunt family out of house and home and creating a measure of havoc everywhere he goes. Little Grunt is eventually forced to give up his friend George, but having a dinosaur for a companion can be a life-saving asset, as the Grunt family finds out when a volcano eruption strikes their cave.

Little Grunt and the Big Egg is a nice story, with excellent artistry. I would give it one and a half stars.
