I can't believe that his story just gets better and better. Grace reminds me of Stephanie Plum, in the non-paranormal series. Her personality and snark really remind me of her, but in her own way, had me laughing out loud so many times, I kept getting funny looks from whoever was around me.

Warning, this will have spoilers for Book 1, Huntress! You have been warned.

Now that Grace is training and settling into her powers, and physical changes, things really get interesting. In the beginning, things are going well for Drew aka Adonis and Grace, and the relationship with Grace and Zeus has improved a lot, like a real family now. We get to see so much more action, and more of Olympus, and some major surprises involving Drew, and something really interesting comes up with Grace's son Dylan. I am not telling you either, lol. It was a shock and loved it.

I liked the addition of many more characters, mostly, Hope was unstable for sure (not saying WHO she is, you can find out) We get to meet Athena, and other famous Greek "Gods" even though after book one, we know that they are Alanteans, who the stories were written about them, as they are Immortal, and some of them, acted like Gods.

I really liked Heph (Hephaestus, who is known as the God of Fire and Craftsmen, son of Zeus and Hera, not married to anyone in this story, he is a mystery) (To me, he looks like Chris Hemsworth, and yes I know, I say that a lot, lol, I am obsessed, lol, but add dark hair, as I learned later that part, but Chris was already stuck in my head) he is a very big guy. (Think Thor, lol) and gorgeous too. He becomes a possible love interest for Grace, who has feelings for Adonis/Drew, who needs to get his crap together on some major issues that come up in this book. I hope Grace will truly forgive him for these issues.
