Truth be told, I wasn't the least bit sure of what to expect from this installment in the Mossy Glenn Ranch series. While we've seen Salt around quite a bit in the previous books due to him being one of the first hires, I hadn't really formed a strong opinion of him. Yes, I liked that he was protective of Drake when Ian first showed up, even if it was misguided, but other than that he's been a bit of a mystery. In *Saddles & Memories* we learn far more about the weathered cowboy than I expected and the man's layers are far deeper than he likes to let on, especially his sensitive side.

As an older cowboy, Salt is quite relieved to have found his place at the Mossy Glenn Ranch. Having spent most of his life in the closet, the sense of peace he feels for being accepted for who he is rather than being judged for his homosexuality is welcomed. Like his bosses, he doesn't make a big deal of his sexual orientation when in town, but it's no longer a secret that the Mossy Glenn tends to hire from the LGBT community. It's because this is becoming common knowledge that Andy Calder takes a chance on approaching the cowboy while in town trying to make news sales contacts for his company's organic feed line. Long since resigned to a life of one-night stands, Salt is ready, willing, and able to show Andy just how well this old cowboy can ride. And their night together is hot, so hot in fact that the men break their personal rules and agree to a repeat performance, well several repeat performances. As they spend more and more time together, they both begin to want for more than their current arrangement but neither is willing to say anything in fear of scaring the other man off. Just as things begin to get serious, Andy gets a call about a family emergency that sends his life spinning out of control and Salt proves to be the stabilizing force in his life he didn't realize he needed. But with all the changes facing Andy in his personal life, the two men have to decide if what they have is strong enough to endure the storm.

I loved *Saddles & Memories*! Watching Salt and Andy cruise each other in the feed store was both amusing for a southern girl and hot to watch. The attraction between the two men was intense and I found myself caught up in their passion when they were able to act upon it. Seriously squirm inducing cowboy lovin' going on in this installment. As their relationship progressed from just sexual to more, it was sweet to watch the two men fall in love – not because it was sappy, but because both men had faced obstacles in their past that left me feeling as though they were perfect for each other. I really, really liked how Salt not only accepted Ty as a package deal with Andy, but that he embraced and cherished the chance to have the family he never expected to have as a gay cowboy. Saul 'Salt' Johnson is forty-five years old and has spent his whole life as a ranch hand doing what he loves to do. He never minded not being in a relationship because he sure wasn't going to out himself at any of the other ranches he worked at. But, the Mossy Glenn Ranch is different and he can be himself there for the first time ever. Which is liberating but also a little scary. Salt also has a best friend for the first time in his life and it's a woman, Rocky, who works with him. He's discovering there are a lot of things he might have missed over the years, and when he meets Andy at the feed store, he's thinking a long-term relationship might just be the biggest one.

Andy Calder is thirty-seven and the co-owner of Organic Feeds. He took one look at Salt in the feed store and knew he had to have him. The problem is how Salt made him feel and Andy isn't so sure that's a good thing. He's spent his whole life, pretty much, doing casual hookups, much like Salt has, so Andy isn't sure why he's all of a sudden wishing for more. Talking it out, or as much talking as men do, Salt and Andy agree to be friends with benefits for when Andy's business brings him to the area. Andy isn't really out because of the business and the risk to sales that could cause and Salt certainly can understand that.

Thus begins Andy and Salt's texting and phone call friendship. Andy's a little freaked out about how much he looks forward to those conversations and is this violating some rule in the friends with benefits arena? When Andy turns down the opportunity to hook up at a bar, he knows it's time for him and Saul to talk about maybe being more than friends with benefits. A tenuous monogamous relationship begins between two men who have no idea what they're doing. Andy tells Salt about his family and the guilt he carries that he didn't fight harder to keep custody of his nephew when his brother died, and his difficulties with his younger brother.

Oh I loved this story! Andy and Salt were so perfect for each other and, in the end, they got their happy ever after and their family. It is a wonderful story and now I'm desperate for the next installment. I love the Mossy Glenn Ranch and I want to see more and more of it. Salt Johnson kennt keine Beziehungen oder tieferen Gefühle. Seine Sexualität hat er immer gut versteckt und über One Night Stands ist er nie hinausgekommen. Doch all das hindert ihn nicht daran sich zu Andy Calder hingezogen zu fühlen. Der ist nur kurz in der Stadt und arbeitet als Futtermittelvertreter.

Andy hadert noch immer mit dem Tod seines Bruders und dem Verlust des Neffen Tys. Auch er hat keine Beziehungen und sucht auch nicht nach mehr als nur Sex. Doch da ist dieser ruhige, schweigsame Cowboy. Ein Blick reicht aus um zu wissen, was sie wollen. Doch was als One Night Stand gedacht war, entwickelt eine für beide Männer überraschende Dynamik.

Teil drei der Reihe hat mich überrascht – positiv. Natürlich ist auch diese Geschichte wieder wenig tiefgründig beschrieben und die Helden fühlen sich eben sehr schnell zueinander hingezogen. Doch sie überstürzen nichts, wägen ab und müssen auch mit einigen Problemen klarkommen. Das Drama ist also vorprogrammiert, wird jedoch nie banal und es gibt ein paar sehr traurige und ernste Momente, die der Geschichte durchaus Tiefe geben.

Salt kennt man ja schon aus den vorigen Teilen. Da wird er als sehr fürsorglich und beschützend dargestellt.
