It is nice for me to read something from the other side, in terms of fighting in the Vietnam War. However, I did feel the author hadn't done sufficient research and it could have been any conflict in Asia, the Korean War had only just finished in the 1950's. From my limited understanding one of the main features of Vietnam was the draft, enforced conscription, although the story suggests Kaylob is a willing, professional soldier. What about his colleagues, how did they feel about being there? No mention is also made of napalm which was used extensively from 1963 onwards, although the famous photo wasn't taken until 1972. Despite being used in World War II this chemical is very much associated with Vietnam in people's minds. There are, however, the stereo typical commie expletives.

The thread of Kaylob and Beth Ann's relationship is a strong theme in the book and makes the ending both

fitting and logical. Blake, as the other man, is suave and sophisticated, yet tinged with an unexpected undercurrent of violence, making a lovely contrast with the loving professional soldier.

My biggest problem with this book is we are told not shown the story. If we are to see and feel Kaylob's experiences then we need a lot more description. Perhaps it would help to know a couple of the guards, reinforce their roles as the villains. Do they have any redeeming features? What about his fellow prisoners, is he kept in complete isolation?

Beth Ann's breakdown is understandable and engenders a lot of sympathy for her. The reader does get the feeling of her falling apart due to the visions and the cutting of her hair. However, there needs to be more scenes like this where we see her interacting with other characters and together with her emotional and physical reaction.

In terms of language and motifs there are some nice distinguishing characteristics, Beth Ann's red hair, Blake's dimples, Kaylob's warmth and strength. Some readers may question the use of pronouns, women use more in their writing than men. Perhaps this is something to be aware of. The prose is a little wordy in places. Modern writing tends to lean towards brief short sentences with not too many joining words and limited adjectives.

Overall this is a pleasant heartfelt story for those who like romance, but are not too squeamish when it comes to fighting in a war zone.

At long last they can now bring their dream to fruition and then Kaylob gives her the unexpected news that he has to go back to Vietnam. Beth Ann is devastated by the news but once she knows the reason why, she reluctantly comes to term with his decision. He is an honourable man who doesn't break his promises. They make the most of the time they have together before he departs. Their love for each other only intensifies even when they think that it couldn't get any stronger.

The time for Kaylob to go back arrives a little too soon. Saying goodbye once more is heartbreaking but there is the promise that the next reunion will be for good. Not long after, Kaylob goes missing and then presumed dead. Beth Ann goes into melt down as she doesn't know how to live without him. She also refuses to accept that he is not coming back. With the support of family and friends, she eventually tries to resume some form of normality. As time passes, she does her best to have a "normal" life. She gets a break in her career and at the same time someone from her past declares his undying love for her. She is very

apprehensive about starting another relationship. The bond between Kaylob and Beth Ann materialises in the most fascinating and unusual way even though they are apart. She has to make a decision. Accept things as they are and move on or live in hope. Just when she makes her decision, along comes this twist.

The first part of this story is riveting. The ordeals that the loved ones have to go through whilst at war are very upsetting. The love of two soul mates is unmistakable. The love and support of family and friends is remarkable. There is unrequited love, confusion and anguish. The heartache is so palpable.

I have just finished reading this book and it has left me with quite intense feelings. What happens now?

Seasons of Love and War is a heart-tugging love story about Beth Ann Rose and her childhood boyfriend turned fiancé, Kaylob Shawn O'Brien. Kaylob returns to Beth Ann following a tour of duty in the jungles of Vietnam where he lost a best friend and promised his brothers in battle that he'd return. It was a promise he hadn't shared with his fiancée. Beth Ann had expected Kaylob was home to stay.

The author does a great job of establishing an intense romance between Kaylob and Beth Ann early in the novel. Even though Beth Ann is a 20-year-old aspiring Broadway performer and Kaylob is a soldier years older, they had yet to consummate their relationship. Kaylob had committed to Beth Ann's brother he'd wait until marriage. I found their abstinence a little unusual at first, especially given Beth Ann's behavior later in the story. However, I came to appreciate portraying Beth Ann as "forbidden fruit" made succumbing to their desires during Kaylob's short leave even more passionate and meaningful to the story.

Kaylob returns to the front lines in Vietnam where he goes missing and assumed killed. Beth Ann doesn't accept word of Kaylob's death. Near suicide, she crumbles, but her life and career are rebuilt with the help of close friends. A couple of Beth Ann's male friends, Frankie and Blake, become strangely close to her. Blake is the more persistent in his affections, ripping at Beth Ann's emotions and having her questioning her commitment to Kaylob.

Having lived during the Vietnam era, I'd hoped for a balance between love and war. There were war scenes, some very descriptive, but this was clearly a love story. For those into historical romance novels, it will not disappoint. It is a story of enduring love struggling through painful uncertainty. Not all is solved in this novel, and the author does a good job of setting up the next book. You'll want to download it as you finish the final chapter.
