The problems

1) The characters. The three main characters in this novella are so over-the-top stereotypical, it's not even funny anymore. The "good" girl dating the "good" brother but is secretly attracted to the "bad" brother. And the reason that the "bad" brother is so "bad" is because the parents made him that way. Seriously? I get that the length of this story didn't really lend itself to a whole lot of character development, but this is just sad.

2) The dialogue. It was just painful, particularly during the scene at the beach. I'll let the following excerpt speak for itself:

Keagan pushed [the pizza slice] closer with a smile and a gleam in his eye. "Doesn't the wittle baby wanna eat? Open up the itty bitty tunnel and let the choo choo train come in." "Stop that, silly." I pushed it away. "You'll make me laugh then I'll choke on it."

3) The plot. I get the whole banshee idea. It's a cool concept and one that hasn't been done that often (though I would definitely recommend the Soul Screamers series by Rachel Vincent if anyone is interested in that type of story). Tara's vision of her boyfriend's early death presents a very real and very exciting complication. Unfortunately, my sympathy for his character is very short-lived. It doesn't take long to see that the "good" brother is really a jerk, while the "bad brother is the sweetheart we never knew about.

The positives

An interesting and somewhat reading experience! Honestly I was surprised how much I enjoyed this one. I really can't put my finger on what it is about this one that I enjoyed so much – there's actually quite a bit of content that usually annoys me to an extent.

It pulled me in pretty quickly (which is probably a good thing, considering the length), and I stayed well within it until I was finished.

The characters were both enjoyable and annoying. But when they were annoying, it was in a good way (yeah, it doesn't make sense to me either...) that made me want to press on rather than give up. They each had qualities that made me like them, then hate them, then like them again... I was rooting for a different person (especially back and forth between the brothers) the whole time. So that was well done.

Honestly my only complaint on this one is that it was so short – I wish there was more of the story! I'd

gladly read it!

This is more like a short story than a book. The main issue I have is that the author doesn't understand what a banshee is which is a feminine spirit in Irish mythology, usually seen as an omen of death and a messenger from the Other world. In the mythology that I am aware of if you hear a banshee or it jumps on your back you are going to die. In this poorly researched story the banshee in question is actually a physic who can see people's deaths. The fact that the girl has been dating one brother for years and just by having a conversation can change their futures is a shallow plot line. The way she uses her female wiles to make the men do what they want is somewhat depressing especially for a female teenage audience. Uninteresting characters and a weak plot ensure this isn't worth your time.

I didn't get very far before the book completely lost me. Most of what I read revolved around the main

character's monologue about how wonderful her football playing boyfriend is. She monologues about how grateful she is that he has a long life ahead of him. As soon as she started in about her status of virginity and how confused - but afraid - she was, how she wonders how long her boyfriend will stay faithful to her because she won't sleep with him (yet), I knew this book is not at all close to my tastes.

You don't get to know the characters very well, and there's really only the one plot but, again, it's a short story so you can't expect too much. Good for the YA audiences with a paranormal flair. Very quick read.
