David Hagberg wrote lots of books. As of now, 20 of them are with a CIA assassin name Kirk McGarvey. I admit that I have not started with the 1st book named "Without Honor", but with #8 – "Joshua's Hammer". At the time I enjoyed reading #8 and gave it a 5 star. Next one I read #14 – "The Cabal", which I didn't like and gave it 1 star. Reason was that I thought the author "starched" a story worth only 150 pages into a 300 pages. This book "24 Hour" was just long enough. It is 100 pages long. It has all the ingredients of a good suspenseful and fast reading book (It is more like a booklet). Only problem with the book, was that the editor missed at least 3 places I recall which needed corrections (I know, I should have marked them and point them out in my review, but as I said it's a fast reading book, and you can't just stop to mark some incorrect sentences).

One of the problems with a series of books with a single hero, is that the author tend to develop its character only during the first few books. So if you read "24 Hours" without the background of previous "Kirk McGarvey" books you may find out that the main hero character is not developed at all.

My recommendation - start from book #1
