If I were to summarize this book in a word, the best non-invective term would probably be 'tripe'.

I won't waste too many words reviewing a book whose entire lexicon probably contains about a hundred basic vocabulary terms and which basically boasts a poetic imaginary to reflect it. There is no poetry in this thing. There is no creativity or artistic sensibility. There isn't even an aesthetic of the vulgar, as it's not foul language or an objectification of women bordering on misogyny that make it bad, it's simply the lack of any sort of inventiveness or imagination, as well as the complete absence of any kind of gift of dealing with the banal. Every single 'poem' in this, fortunately, small tome (in which the large size of the fonts at least contributes to finishing it quicker) is not just lazy to a mind-numbing extent, but so tediously expressed that one wonders how anyone in their right mind would even bother putting it down on paper, let alone eventually publishing it. Reading this feels like reading nothing, or worse, it feels as if your brain is actively depleted of prior knowledge by the very act of going through the pages. It almost feels like an eternity trying to get to the end of it, as no speed can be quick enough to get done with it.

On the bright side, I never had to pay anything for the book, as I 'won' it in a giveaway. I still feel like I've needlessly killed a tree by having it, but it will likely find its way into a recycling bin soon enough, and I've never yet thrown away a book unless it was damaged beyond repair. In this case, its own content is the damage. I actually feel it's safe to say it was the worst book I've ever read and I would give it zero stars if I could. It makes other one-star books I've rated around here look like Shakespeare. It may seem like a harsh review, but in the end, it's the quality (or, rather, the absolute lack thereof) of the book's contents and the re-reading of some bits in it for the purpose of reviewing that made me spew this vitriolic piece.

Don't buy this. And if you do, certainly don't give it to your lover unless you no longer wish to have anything to do with them.
