This is my first review for m/m, but not my first read.

Let's talk about babies. Collin is a solar eclipse omega, which makes him a rare find. Even his own kind don't know he exists. So when he starts working for Riley, a sexy alpha rock star, he knows he's going to have some long hours. They both do an admirable job resisting the pull, until they can't take it any longer. Problem is, Collin has issues in his past that make him wary of relationships and the fact that Riley is an alpha makes them worse. Add in baby, and the mental anguish steps up to a whole new level. Lucky for him, Riley is determined and in love.

I really liked this book. It's well-written and sweet. The only problem I had was that I didn't find the backstory that gives the groundwork for this world. It took until almost the end for me to find out for sure that the boys are wolves. Still didn't answer most of the questions, though. Are they shifters? This second addition, Rockstar Baby, features an Alpha rock star learning to stand on his own two feet and an Omega bodyguard who has no desire to be the little homemaker. It is written in alternating first person past tense. I have a hard time with first because I forget which "I" I'm actually reading and tend to have to check back frequently. Your mileage may vary. *wink*

Riley and Colin have a night together that neither can get out of their heads, but when Riley hires Colin to be his bodyguard, Colin putting on the brakes hard is not what the singer had in mind. Unfortunately for him, Colin has a no mixing business with pleasure policy, so Riley has his hands tied until he can figure out how to entice the sexy Omega back into his bed.

Urban fantasy is quickly becoming one of my favorite things, and the joy that is this book is set amidst the realities of today's world. As the lead singer of a rock band whose biggest audience are teenage girls, Riley's continuing closet life is something that his manager and pseudo-father thinks is best for the band's success. Unfortunately, Riley is suffering personally as a result. Watching his struggle to be ready to open himself up to the world's scrutiny and the fears espoused by his manager is heartbreaking, and is portrayed beautifully.

There is a fairly small cast of characters through the majority of the book, but each has a significant impact on the story. Having the main characters from the first book woven lightly throughout this story created a richer whole. That said, you don't have to read *My Omega's Baby* first, but it will definitely add to the experience.

The chemistry is off the charts hot, and the struggles the two men face makes the inevitable coming together even more powerful. With this also comes strong character development on both main characters.

The plot is basically your average contemporary style, but there is a dash of suspense thrown in for fun. The pacing ebbs and flows, but never bogs down in any given spot. By the end, you find yourself cheering for this couple...and eagerly awaiting the next story! I am rating this at four solid stars. I definitely recommend you grab this and the first in the series. You won't regret it!

Starting with that completely adorable cover, I liked this book even better than the first (*My Omega's Baby*). It's a sweet story, with a bit of action and suspense, and while it could be read as a standalone, I think you'd get more out of it and understand the background of the world of solar eclipse omegas and their alphas better having read the first book.

Riley, who we met in the first book, is a young, gentle alpha and a closeted rockstar on the rise. Colin is a bodyguard, and a solar eclipse omega, who is recovering from a devastating personal loss. When Colin and Riley meet there is an instant pull toward the other that neither has experienced before. Riley likes the calming effect Colin has on him while Colin sees that Riley isn't the typical aggressive alpha. Colin's seen too many of those to ever trust them and he's an independent omega who doesn't need an alpha anyway. The two have a hot night together, but the fact that Riley is closeted is not something that Colin can live with. When Riley offers Colin the job of his bodyguard – with no strings attached – the challenge begins; can they keep it professional? Colin is pretty firm about not mixing business with pleasure, but Riley is up for the challenge and suddenly the thought of stardom without being able to share it with someone he cares for isn't all that appealing.

Told in alternating POV, it was easy to become invested in both men's attraction to each other and understand why it's so difficult for each man to commit to a relationship. Not only do they have serious chemistry, but Colin and Riley also really like each other as people. Both have family issues and pasts that they are struggling with and that are part of the reason why it's difficult to move forward. Once they have

spent time together, Riley, much to the chagrin of his sometimes overbearing manager Tom, is ready to come out and risk the backlash. Add into the mix a possible stalker and the men have plenty of bumps to overcome even before Riley finds out about the secret of the solar eclipse omega and what one night of throwing caution and logic to the wind will bring.

Unlike the first story, Riley and Colin are not fated mates so even though their alpha and omega are drawn to each other, they have a bit more control over themselves and the progression of their relationship. There was a bit of a slower build despite the first quick hook up as they get to know each other. I enjoyed their friendly back and forth, their support of each other, the moments of jealousy and the teasing. I liked that their dynamic wasn't typical alpha/omega. Riley's alpha is subdued while Colin's omega isn't overly needy. They both are protective of the other and they both need comfort and reassurance. All of this worked for me to make the tale a bit more emotional than the first.

The pregnancy storyline was well played out, from the surprise at Colin's sudden urge to breed to the fear of what he's done and wondering just how Riley would react and the transition from Colin's fear of babies to OMG I'm going to be a father! I was happy to see Blade and Wyatt back to support Colin from the start. Riley is the perfect alpha for Colin and if his experience at the birthing compound is anything to go by, I'm hoping Riley will be back in the next book helping out another prickly, hurting omega.

I was glad to find out a bit more about the mysterious Ancients and how they fit into things, but I'm still a little hazy on the connection of these former wolves to the human world. There are some references to humans knowing about them, but I'm not sure just how much the two groups are integrated. This is just a minor niggle though as I'm thoroughly enjoying the focus on this group of alphas and omegas.

So this was another sexy, sweet, emotional and fun story in the series and if there is a next story I will be jumping on it.

The alpha/omega dynamic is always interesting because it's usually something we expect. My favorite dynamics are where those roles become less important than the characters themselves. This is one such relationship. Colin is a solar eclipse omega, a special breed that is known by the Ancients. I don't have a lot of background on this and at times those terms and structures were confusing. Despite that, it was easy to see that he is terribly unsure of how to handle what he feels growing for Riley. Riley isn't a typical alpha, he's understanding, generous, patient, and kind. Colin isn't sure how to navigate what he feels for Riley especially because Riley seems to be such a good match. With his own past fueling his insecurities and prejudice it's hard for Riley to overcome and be invited inside Colin's heart. Riley wants so much more from Colin and is willing to reveal his own secret to the world both for himself and for the chance to be with Colin as more than a one night stand. They are both building something beyond just sex and I appreciated all that they worked for before they found additional passion to add to their one evening. They made a great team and brought out the best in one another. With the drama of babies and careers neither are sure of much but when they work together you can see that there's a great deal of potential. I enjoyed both of these men and how they overcame their individual obstacles as well as how they faced the rest as partners.

I liked the book enough for 3 stars, could have given the book 4 stars if I didn't give a care. But I do, so therefore 3 stars - I felt like, to atleast give it 4 stars, it would have to contain more "heat" between the main character's since it is a romance book :)

At time I felt like the book was dragged along by all those conversations and the lack of romance/action. It was like standing on a hill, going down the hill, going up again.... Which is okay I guess, it's just that at times it felt the way back up the hill was long and dragged when it could have been avoided.

There was a lot of concern for Riley and his safety a lot of times which I get since it is about him and his security guard, but.... could have focused more on the romance part and get-to-know-your-soulmate part <3 And if that wasn't enough Colin has major trust issues with Alpha's - Okay totally fine, but I felt that it went on for too long, yes he is traumatized by previous events in his life, that he is afraid or is too hard to open up about. But I felt like Riley was put on hold (if you can call it that) for far too long - He's trying!

Tom/Tim - Riley's manager, I couldn't really figure that guy out, guess there was a lot of miscommunication between him and Riley, but at times (a lot) he was nothing but a pain to read about, and I actually got frustrated on Riley part.

At times I felt confused, because of Riley's actions (and sometimes Colin's), I got confused about who's the alpha and who's the omega - To clear it up if others feel confusion RILEY = ALPHA and COLIN = OMEGA.

I also felt like there was some missing information/clarification on the Solar Eclipse Omegas

I liked how this was a different kind of Mpreg romance book, but to wait after the 50-60% to feel that this is a mpreg book, felt prolonged /dragged on.
