This book is part hilarity and part drama. John Lee Quarrels is a Deputy Sheriff in small town Florida. His father-in-law, DW, is the Sheriff and his brother-in-law, Flag "Fig" Newton, is the Chief Deputy. John Lee is married to DW's daughter, who is generally gone to find herself, mostly with another woman. Her younger sister often stops by unannounced to pick up the slack left by the sister, because she has no need to find herself. DW is mostly a politician, whose main interest is in remaining sheriff. Fig is a mostly unlikable dude who thinks he would make a much better sheriff. That is where a bulk of the hilarity comes in. You don't have to imagine it, Russell lays it out for you. Very funny stuff!

Now for the drama. Construction workers have uncovered the bodies of 3 men, each of whom had been tied up with barbed wire and shot in the back of the head over 50 years ago. While John Lee is investigating, a sniper starts taking pot shots at his police vehicle. A couple days later, a sniper takes shots at another sheriff's deputy. It was decided that the sniper hit what he was aiming at and did not intend to kill anybody. But the next time it happens, a deputy ends up dead. Nothing funny about this part. Maybe the best part about this book is that you are truly given no clues as to who the sniper is, and why he is doing it, until well toward the end of the book.
